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1. In compliance with Paragraph 7d, AF Letter 200-5, dated 29 April 1952, the following information is submitted:

a. One (1) very distinct flying saucer displaying vivid colors was observed, and reported by Mrs. [redacted] Grand Junction, Colorado at approximately 1630 hours MST, Sunday, 19 April 1953.

b. Mrs. [redacted] stated, while driving in the vicinity of the oil shale plant, Grand Valley, Colorado, enroute to Grand Junction, Colorado, she observed a flying saucer, flying above and beyond an airplane enroute from Denver to Grand Junction, Colorado.

c. Mrs. [redacted] stopped her car and watched for sometime.

d. No other remarks, such as; photos, altitude, vapor trails, audible sound, weather phenomenon, maneuvers, speed, dimension, etc. were reported.

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
