

Ceneral Remarks:

The four power scope used was a rifle scope. One observer reported the object was glowing and lighted. No interception was attempted, no physical evidence was produced, no photographs or sketches were submitted. However, high altitude balloons were reported in the general vicinity of the sighting. Seattle NAS VHF/DF facilities reported that at 1830PST a balloon which they were tracking was on a balloon to station bearing of 60, a class B fix. At 1900PST the balloon to station bearing was 60, and at 1930PST the balloon to station bearing was 50, still a class B plot. Several aircraft were flying locally at the time of sighting but none were reported at high altitude.
