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Statement of facts received from A/3C Wendell C. Smith, AF 51464063. This Airmn is assigned to Hq Sq Sec Air Base Group, Ellington AFB, Houston, Texas where he is employed as an aircraft dispatcher.


On the evening of the 19th of May 1953, the airmen were at their respective duties at Base Operations when a telephone call was received from an unidentified person off base asking what type aircraft was in the vicinity of Houston and Ellington AFB. The Airmen went out to observe the object which was bright yellowish orange although not as bright as the stars. When first sighted, between 2230 and 2245, the object was directly overhead. The object remained visible from one to two minutes. During this time, it followed a straight course from 900 to 270°. The shape appeared to be round. No exhaust trail was seen. There was no sound heard, Maneuvers were in a straight line, Sighting continued above the horizon until it was no longer visible, due to distance. The observation was from the surface and was visual although an attempt was made to obtain a fix with theodolite which was unsuccessful. Speed was very fast but unable to be estimated accurately as size of object and altitude were unknown. The skies were clear with wind at the surface light. The surface air was warm. There was no known meteorclosical activity to account for the sighting. There is no physical evidence such as photographs to work up sighting. There was no interception taken. 149th ACSV Sq this base was contacted but did not receive a radar return.






