Dear Sir:

In accordance with your request I am forwarding to you my observations of an unnamed object flying around in the vicinity of the Amarillo Air Terminal on August 3, 1953, at 1204 CST P.M.

I was in the Amerille Control Tower on August the 3, 1953 and was looking north out of the tower cab for an aircraft when I observed an object which I first thought was a balloom moving from the east to the west, it was moving faster than a balloon and was holding an altitude approximately 45 degrees above the horizon and continuing east until reaching a position slightly east of a position north of the tower and coming to a stop. I realized that this object was not a balloom as it did not rise and that it was moving faster than the wind could move a balloon. This object was close enough to see that it was round and was reflecting the sun giving off a translucent appearance. The object remained in the same position for approximately seven seconds and the Assistant Controller in the tower, was called to look at it, as Mr Reid was coming out on the catwalk around the tower the object started south and with what appeared to be tremendous speed moved to a position over the sisport coming to a stop, Mr Said I see it and as it was coming to a stop he said see the other one behind it, I then observed a second object stop behind the first both appearing to be identical in size, shape and appearance. They remained ever the field approximately 10 seconds and then the first one started straight up and the second one proceeded south both disappearing at a repid rate in approximately four seconds.

At no time did the objects change shape from an appearance of being round, no vapor trail or make observed. When the objects came to a stop they did not appear to slow up but came to an abrupt stop. It is not possible to estimate altitude or size of the object as no hills mountains or snything to use as a base for an estimate. The sky was a blue with no clouds at all.

Approximately 15 minutes later Mr. West went back out on the catwalk of the tower and observed what could have been the same objects in the vicinity of the sam appearing to circle, these objects would only be visible for a few seconds then disappear, reappearing or being some more of the same in a different position, we observed these off and on for approximately 45 minutes then clouds were moving over and they were not observed. The first object was seen at 1204 PM GST and the last time observed approximately 1300 GST.


1. Mr Commissions reported to this office the following information on observations he had made while on duty at Amarillo Air Terminal, Amarillo, Texas on 3 August 1953:

- c. Approximately 15 minutes later it was observed what could have been the same objects in the vicinity of the sum, appearing to circle. These were observed off and on for approximately 45 minutes, but then clouds started moving over and they were not observed my more. The first object was seen at 1204 PM CST and the last time observed was approximately 1300 PM CST.
