





In compliance with AF Ltr 200-5, dated 29 April 1952, the following information is submitted:

1. Object was reddish brown light, larger than a star, without reflector or sound, moving south in erratic up and down motion at approximately 1500 to 2000 feet altitude.
2. Object observed at approximately 0015 hours 22 August 1953 for approximately 25 to 30 seconds.
3. A visual ground observation without optical or electronic equipment was made.
4. Observers were at their residence, [REDACTED], San Antonio, Texas.
5. Object was observed by Mr. and Mrs. [REDACTED], reliability unknown.
6. Temperature at 1500 feet at time of sighting was 75°, dew point 61°; temperature at 2000 feet was 72°, dew point 63°. Clouds at 6000 feet scattered; estimated 12000 feet broken. Visibility 12 miles. Sea level pressure 1015.7 MB; temperature 50°, dew point 71°. Wind calm, altimeter 20.01 inches. Winds alert, 2000 feet, ESE 10 knots.
7. No activity or condition, meteorological or otherwise, is known to have existed at the time, which might have accounted for the sighting.
8. No physical evidence of the sighting.
9. Observer notified the Sergeant of the Guard at Kelly Air Force Base, Texas.
10. Air traffic — C-47 landed at 2300 from NW; B-25 landed at 0020 from N; C-54 landed at 0041 from NE. C-54 landed at 0007 from N.

S T A T E M E N T

At approximately 0015 hours 22 August 1953, the undersigned sighted, west of my house, 155 Fabard Drive, about one-half mile away, a reddish brown light without reflector or sound moving south in an erratic up and down motion across the sky, at approximately 1500 to 2000 feet altitude. The actual speed is unknown, but it seemed to move fairly slowly. It appeared to be larger than a star and resembled a star.

About 5 seconds after I sighted this object, I called my wife, Grace Foley, out of the house and we both had a visual observation of the object for approximately 20 seconds longer when it slowly disappeared behind the houses across the street, moving from south to east.

About 10 minutes later an aircraft was sighted flying a southeast path. He turned on his landing light which were easy to distinguish as landing lights. Also, he could be heard. About 6 minutes after this aircraft was sighted, another one was sighted flying from south to north, and this aircraft passed to east of house, and was also heard.



## Hydrographic Bulletin

### METEOR

The Hydrographic Office is cooperating with astronomers who are studying meteors. Mariners reporting their observations of these bodies are greatly assisting in this work. It is desired to have the Greenwich time and point of appearance and disappearance as accurate as possible, either by bearing and altitude, or by relation to fixed stars, or both.

Complete observations on long-enduring trains and their direction of drift are of especial importance, as they determine wind direction in the upper atmosphere.

### NORTH ATLANTIC

Chief Officer Francis Campbell of the British SS. *Bembridge Hill* reports that on August 23, 1953, in lat. 40°00' N., lon. 40°30' W., a brilliant body, traveling in an E. by S. direction was observed.

The first indication of any phenomenal occurrence was a bright green diffused glow on the superstructure of the ship, lasting for about 1 second. This green light was reflected from the sea directly beneath the traveling body.

The body, traveling extremely fast, coursed parallel to the surface of the sea and disappeared into the clouds emitting a stream of "sparklers."
