Mr. and Mrs were driving north on Highway #14 approximately
15 miles South of Janesville, Wisconsin, when Mrs hooking out of
the right car window saw a strange bright object. The object appeared to
have a reddish color or glow like a bright light on a high tower. Mrs.
immediately called this strange light to the attention of her husband, and
they both agreed to its strange appearance.

A few minutes after the first sighting, the object seemed to move slowly to the left and then appeared to move very swiftly. The object seemed to move directly in front of the car and appeared a very bright white color, something like an explosion. After the explosion like effect, the object seemed to have a tail like or trail effect. As the object appeared to move away from in front of the car to the right, the object appeared to change from the bright white to an orange color and then to the original reddish color.

Mrs. Frolled down her car window thinking maybe it was a reflection in the glass, but the object appeared just as bright with the car
window rolled down.

Mr. States to estimated the object to be at an altitude of 5,000 to 8,000 feet. Except when the object appeared to have the explosion like effect with a tail, the object had a sharp definite outline. In comparison to this object, the stars in the sky appeared very dim and dull. The sky was clear at the time of the observation. At a distance the object appeared to come closer to the earth, but it did not appear any larger, but very much brighter.

The object was constantly under observation from the time of first sighting, 2045 CST, until approximately 2200 CST, when Mr. and Mrs. Bertke arrived in the outer edge of Madison, Wisconsin.
