## A. F. Displays 'Flying Stiletto'

WASHINGTON, Nov. 16 (UPI)—The Air Force cautiously lifted the secrecy curtain today from its "flying stiletto," a dagger-shaped research plane designed to fly 2,000 miles an hour at extremely high altitudes.

The jet-propelled craft, the X-3, was built by Douglas Aircraft Co. under sponsorship of the Air Force, Navy and National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics. It has been tested at Edwards Air Force Base, Calif., for a year but little has been said about its radical shape.

The X-3 resembles nothing else now flying. It has a long, sharply tapered nose and stubby straight wings. It is 66 feet 9 inches long over all, but its wing span is a mere 22 feet 8 inches.
