## Hydrography Bulletin

### MISCELLANY GULF OF SIAM

Second Officer P. Hansen of the Danish MS. *Arnold Maersk*, Capt. S. Bjerregaard, Master, reports observing a peculiar phenomena of light waves on December 8, 1953, in lat.  $8^{\circ}40'$  N., lon.  $102^{\circ}20'$  E., at 0143 L. C. T. The light waves extended to the horizon in all directions and were similar to very luminous phosphorescence. They appeared to be about 6 feet above the sea surface, pulsating rapidly. The time interval between pulsations was about one-tenth second and the display lasted for 15 minutes.

Weather overcast with heavy clouds, wind NW. force 3, sea rough, barometer 29.86 inches, air temperature  $80^{\circ}$  F.
