'The Thing' Starts A New Wing-Ding

OTTAWA, Dec. 12.—Canadian Air Force radar experts scanned the skies for a "thing" today after a crew of a trans-Canada Air Lines plane reported spotting a strange greenish-blue light over Lake Ontario.

The pilot and co-pilot of the TCA plane, bound from New York to Toronto, said they had sighted the light about 9 p.m. yesterday.

It brightened the clouds as it descended slowly, they reported.
