TIME: Approximately 1500, 7 April 1954.


MOCATION: Objects were first observed approximately two miles west of lake Drumond at an altitude of 3500 feet.

STATEMENT OF OMERITER:

At approximately 1500, 7 April 1954, while engaged in flying an air m For type sirerest for Floot Training Center tude of 3500 feet flying in very close promisity to each other, as in formation with each other. My altitude was 3000 feet. Visibility in all directions was 20 to 25 miles. As shown on attached chart in diagram, the objects were approximately 15 miles from me when I first sighted them. My fixet impression of the objects immediately made me think "two birds flying protty high and right under the base of the elouds, then as the objects changed their relative position so repidly and came into better view, I was able to distinguish them as dise-chaped. I immediately started turning my plane and kept them in might with they disappeared in the vicinity of Cape Henry in an Basterly direction. They were dark colored - i.e., they gave no inpression of color other than that they showed up dark against the white background of the cumuliform type clouds. There was no apparent notion directly around the discs - the only impression there was that of very great speed, in that they flow through a gentle and constant are of approximately 1800, covering comembers around 30 miles in the time of 25 to 30 seconds.
