- 1. I am the foreman in charge of Box and Lumber Reclamination in the Material Pacilities Division at Middletown Air Material Area, Middletown, Pennsylvania. I have worked at Clasted Air Force Base as a civilian employee for approximately ten years.
- 2. On Thursday evening my wife the and a friend of mine, the party of my home when my wife exclaimed, "look at the meteor." This was approximately thirteen minutes to ten o'clocks
  - 5. I looked into the sky in an easterly direction and saw a semi-oval object with an orange glow moving in a northerly direction. This object appeared to me to have come out of the southeast part of Permeylvania.
  - 4. I would judge that this object was approximately a mile and a half to two miles above the ground level. It seemed to me that it was at the same height as the broken clouds in the sty at that time. It looked like the size of a grapofruit.
  - 5. This object definitely appeared to me to be noving faster than the speed of any commercial plans I had seem. It continued to move at the same speed at all times. It did not move in an are formation and I would say it remained in the same plane at all times.
  - 6. As well as I can remember I can this object in the sky for about fifteen seconds. It finally disappeared from view when it went behind a tree in my back yard. It did not make any sound that I could hear. My wife and Mr. Lindowsth were watching with me at all times.
