



At 2240 hours, Airman GALLAGHER was again telephonically contacted for any auditional occurrences, and he stated that the WAF tower operator, Carseell AFB, had observed a red flashing object over Meaches Airport. However, upon request, GALLAGREE obtained information from Nonchess tower through the Carevell AFE tower that a DC-3 aircraft had Landed to the south at Heachem Field, just after (approximately three minutes) the reported sightime & HER also advised that all redar trained on the unidentified object as previously described had, at intervals, lost and regained the blip a their scopes. Upon questiening GallaGHER stated Blak Might had yestored two jets (type and station unknown) to the area; and that Air Traffic Control had requested a 7-6 on local flight out of Honeley Pield to check the area for the object. At this point of the phone call, GALLACHER stated that the Meaches tower operators reported observing another object over Heachen Field. GALLAGHER sonchaded by stating that Major WINSTON P. RICE, AO 671769, A36th Book Squadron, the Airdress Officer, and Captain STIESON (NFI), Flight Services Carewell. APB, had knowledge of the objects; and were at that time checking same. Callacter was at this time requested to advise the COI of any serious developments.
- A. At about OELS hours, 29 April 1954, Major RICE advised Special Agent WILES the object which had been visible on the Sterm Detector Radar in the Base Weather Station the previous evening had again been visible at about 0700 hours, 29 April 1954. Upon recheck at about 0815 hours by Major RICE and Special Agent WILES, the object was visible, positioned as previously described. Special Agent WILES requested: Major RICE, upon motification of 7th Bomb Wing Intelligence Office, in accordance with Base Operations SOP, to advise that office that the information obtained by OSI would be made available upon request. In this respect, RICE was advised that investigations of unidentified
