This altention can happen on outbound flights to the north as well so to the south. Hompton, just north of Saliebury, is used if time for reference when changing flight plane from VIR to IR no well as IR to VIR.

Inclours No. 1 was obtained by observer (6)(a) from USAF Headquarters, Washington, D.C. This observer wrote to Air Force Headquarters asking for information and procedures used in reporting unidentified flying objects. He then, in turn, sent the inclours to this organization.

It is the enalysis of the Reporting Officer that the sightings were an aircraft sees in the process of climbing or turning within the sirvey in the area of Mimpton, Selisbury Beach, and Mowburyport, Mass.
