On 14 June 1954 at approximately 1800 hours an individual who identified himself as Mr. Staten Island, New York, telephonically advised Special Agent at the time, Duty Agent at Headquarters 2d District OSI, that he had observed an unidentified flying object on the Jume 195h and furnished the following information relative thereto:

Size compared to known object: As a ball approximately two (2) inches in diameter would appear if held 15 to 20 feet away. Color - Pasically white, however, blending into reddish tones around the outer circumference.
