10. Location of any air traffic in the area at time of sighting. Foster Tower reported no known traffic.

11. Position title and comments of the preparing officer, including his preliminary analysis of the possible cause of the sightings. Assistant Air Operations Officer. One jet aircraft (F-86F) from this station was airborne at time of report, but was at 40,000 feet. No other jet aircraft were reported in the local area. Preliminary analysis indicates a meteor is the most probable cause of the sighting. There exists the remote and unlikely possibility that the object was a jet aircraft equipped with after burner, with the A.B. in operation.

- a. Shape - Only saw a bluish burst of light, traveling north eastward and slightly diving.
- b. Size compared to a known object (use one of the following terms: head of a pin, bead, dime, nickel, quarter, half dollar, silver dollar, baseball, grapefruit, or basketball) held in the hand at about arms length: At least a basketball, only much larger.
- c. Color - Blue.

2. Description of course of object: Was north of Edna, Tex.

- a. What first called the attention of observe to the object: By bright flash.
- b. Angle of elevation and azimuth of the object when first observed: Passed to right. First saw it approximately 4,000', was slightly diving and passed below and to right of us, heading in north east direction.
- c. Angle of elevation and azimuth of object upon disappearance. Approximately 1500' heading in slight diving attitude in north east direction.
- d. Description of flight path and maneuvers of object: Was slightly diving during our observance of object.
- e. Manner of disappearance of object: Flame vanished after few seconds.
- f. Length of time in sight: 10 or 15 seconds.
