UFOB. ATTN, ATTIAA-2C. SIGHTED AT 1055 EASTERN DAYLIGHT TIME,  
FROM HILLCREST HEIGHTS MARYLAND, WHICH IS BETWEEN BOLLING AND ANDREWS AIR  
FORCE BASES. WAS CIRCULAR IN SHAPE WITH LIGHT BEAMS OR RAYS  
RADIATING FROM IT, APPEARED MUCH LIKE A STAR, IT'S SIZE WAS  
COMPARED TO AN AIRCRAFT RECOGNITION LIGHT AT 2000 FT, WAS SAID  
TO BE A WHITE LIGHT WITH A LITTLE YELLOW, WAS FIRST SIGHTED  
DIRECTLY OVERHEAD AND MOVED EAST TOSOUTH EAST WITH LATERAL VARIATIONS UP  
TWENTY DEGREES. IT HOVERED BUT YET APPERARED TO DART DURING THE LATERAL  
VARIATOONS, WAS UNDER OBSERVATION FOR TWO MINUTES, AND WAS BELEIVED  
TO BE BETWEEN 10000 AND 50000 FT. OBSERVER WAS ON GROUND. OBSERVER  
WAS MAJOR [REDACTED] A RATED PIOLET OF 13 YEARS EXPERIANCE.
