AFTER SIZE AND LIGHT INTENSITY CHANGE, ORIGINAL OBJECT WAS JOINED BY A SECOND SIMILAR OBJECT VERY SUDDENLY, THEN TWO (2) MORE SIMILAR OBJECTS APPEARED VERY SUDDENLY TO MAKE A TOTAL OF FOUR (4) OBJECTS IN BOX PATTERN.
