INVESTIGATOR'S SUMMARY

1. A check of the Combat Operations Center, G-11, Cambridge, MA, has produced a negative result in terms of A-1, G-1, and Fighter Interceptor reports.

2. A check of both Cambridge A-1 and Seattle A-1 also indicated negative results.

3. Lt. E. H. Hays, Air Support Group, Wake Field, MA, stated that they had no balloon launching that office. They were stationed at Seattle A-1 and operating out of both Seattle A-1 and Cambridge A-1 but had been involved in some launches in the past few months.

4. Since indications still pointed to the possibility that these objects were of a balloon launching nature, attempts were made to contact the 11th Research Group out of Cambridge Research Unit. It was determined several plans had been set out for Project 1121, now conducting balloon launches with members of the 45124 AISC participating. On 15 Dec 49, Lt. Hays, Wake Field, MA, was supported by members of the Cambridge Research Group operating out of Wakefield A-1. Hays was interviewed on his previous work at Seattle A-1. This interview was conducted in the office of Det 2, 45124 AISC, Cambridge, MA, but no positive results.

5. Lt. Smith stated that he and other members of his group (present during the interview) had participated in balloon launches out of Seattle A-1 and out of the base at Wakefield, MA, on the night of 3 Dec 49. This was a special project for the 11th Research Unit - 1111th Air Support Group (ASG) - 2 (ASG). He further stated that he was positive that this was the object(s) seen by the eight persons listed in the report of this investigation. The 11th ASG was the only group which was authorized to launch balloons from the Seattle A-1 base. The balloons were used for the investigation of possible air pollution. Since they were not sure that the balloons had been officially reported as a U-2 they did not relay anyone of the activity.

6. COMMENTS ON REPORTING OFFICER

The members of Project 1121 referred to in para 5 above were shown a copy of the preliminary report of this office and were positive in their opinion that these launches were the type launches in which they had participated. Their activities are of a classified nature, so further details of these launches are withheld.

All indications, especially the description of a nose tube with K-12 base history on the conclusion that the U-2 was the launch site of the Cambridge Research Unit.

Future launches will be more closely coordinated with the 45124 AISC units in this area in the future.


