11. Intelligence Officer, Captain Luther A. Tarbox, Hq 316th Troop Carrier Group (M), Swart Air Force Base, Tennessee. It is understood by Captain Tarbox that another sighting was made of a similar object approximately the same time in the vicinity of Knoxville, Tennessee by an Air Force officer who mentioned the fact to the observers father upon passing through Nashville. This aroused the observers father and thus the sighting was reported officially. [redacted] has made two previously unreported sightings of UROB and was not cognizant of procedures to be taken. The youngster appears to be of average intelligence, is widely read on UROB in current publications made available to him on news stands and book stores. It is not known whether the child has a highly imaginative mind or not. He appeared to answer the questions directed him in a straight forward manner and was not aided by his mother in any way (Mrs [redacted] was present during the questioning).

It is not possible for the reporting officer to adequately analyze the possible cause of the sighting.
