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

II. RECENT HISTORY: SOURCE was questioned at the [REDACTED] residence. SOURCE was a short and fair haired lady and seemed to be quite healthy and very cooperative. She seemed fairly neat, and about average intelligence.

III. SOURCE'S DESCRIPTION OF OBJECT:

1. SOURCE was standing in the back yard of her residence located at Palo Alto Drive, South San Antonio, Texas (Coordinate 29°42'23"). On the 25th day of Nov. 1954 at 1805Z SOURCE was accompanied by her husband, [REDACTED], age 33, MRS F. [REDACTED], age 29, Mr. [REDACTED], age 29, and three children who also sighted the object. Mrs. [REDACTED] mentioned [REDACTED] to the moving object in the sky by her husband. SOURCE stated the object appeared to be approximately 1 mile away and moving at a very slow rate of speed. Object was brighter than the background of the sky and was about the size of a half dollar at arms length. 

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

SOURCE was in charge of the women's clothing department, so she took sufficient time off for the questioning and to fill out the questionnaire. Details of the sighting were distinctly clear in the SOURCE's mind.


