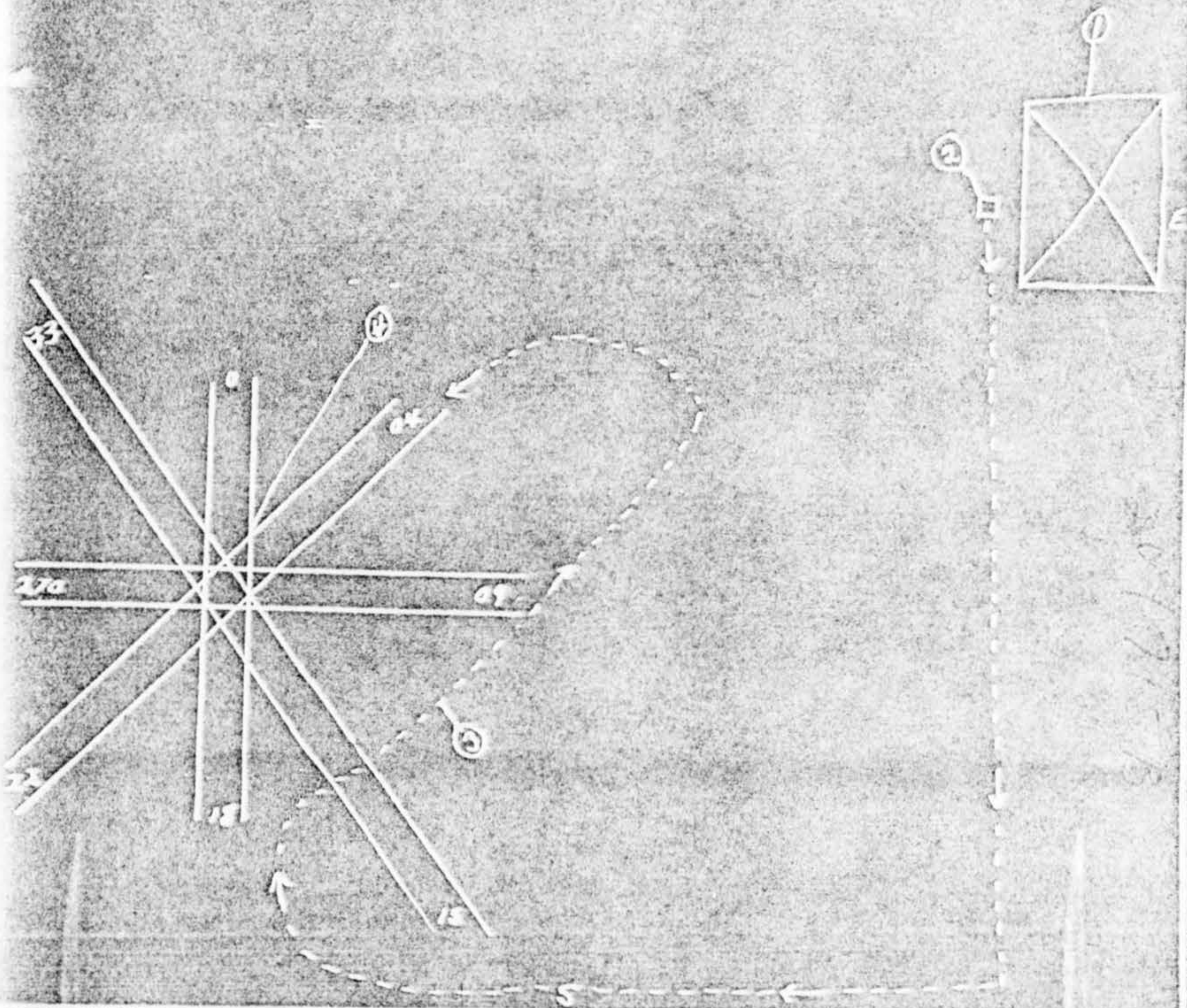

II. RELIABILITY: Source was questioned at the [REDACTED] residence. Source was a short and fat looking lady and seemed to be quite friendly and very cooperative. She seemed fairly neat, and about average intelligence.

III. SOURCE'S DESCRIPTION OF OBJECT

1. SOURCE was standing in the back yard of her residence located at Palo Alto Drive, South San Antonio, Texas (GEORGE FBHQ 2323). On the 25th day of Nov. 1954 at 1805Z SOURCE was accompanied by her husband, [REDACTED], age 33, MRS F. [REDACTED], age 29, Mr. [REDACTED], age 29, and three children who also sighted the object. Mrs. [REDACTED] attention was called to the moving object in the sky by her husband. SOURCE stated the object appeared to be approximately 1 mile away and moving at a very slow rate of speed. Object was brighter than the background of the sky and was about the size of a half dollar at arms length. 2. Object appeared much brighter than the background of the sky and disappeared into the sun at various intervals.

3. Object appeared to be round shaped and solid.

4. SOURCE stated the object was about the size of a small aircraft.

5. On the day of the observation, there was a clear sky. The weather was dry and there was a very slight breeze.

6. Kelly AFB, was notified by Mr. [REDACTED], husband of the source, and negative results were obtained.

7. Object did not change shape but did flicker occasionally.

8. SOURCE thought the object to be a balloon but indicated after a closer observation that it was not similar to any known object such as an aircraft.

IV. INVESTIGATOR'S SUMMARY:

1. A check was made with the following agencies with the indicated results.

- a. Randolph AFB Weather Station: No weather balloons were released on 25/1800Z Nov 54. GEORGE of Randolph AFB - FRGQ 4347
- b. Randolph AFB Air Traffic Section: Negative results.
- c. Kelly AFB MATS Air Traffic and Weather Section: Negative results.
- d. San Antonio Municipal Airport Weather Station (GEORGE FRGQ 3032): Negative results.
- e. Kelly AFB Operations and Air Traffic Section (GEORGE FRGQ 2822): On 25/1750Z Nov 54 a H-13 Helicopter #7956 departed from Ft. San Houston for Kelly AFB, Texas. The H-13's ETA was 25/1805Z Nov 54, but the ATA was 25/1820Z Nov 54. Fort San Houston is an Army Base located in the North East section of San Antonio, Texas. Name of the pilot flying the helicopter was 1/Lt Robert Bowler. Reference Incl#2, Rept 2D-UPOR-4 for Flight Path of H-13 Helicopter.
- f. An additional contact with Kelly AFB Operations and Air Traffic Section revealed the following aircraft were in the vicinity:
 - (1) T-28 type aircraft, #7599, from James Connally AFB, Waco, Texas flew across San Antonio and landed at Kelly AFB at 25/1826Z Nov 54. Pilot's name: Lt. Hubbs.
 - (2) C-47 type aircraft, #9268, departed Kelly AFB at 25/1753Z Nov 54 enroute to James Connally AFB, Waco, Texas.
 - (3) T-6 type aircraft, #1149, departed Kelly AFB on a day local flight. Pilot's name: Lt. Hanna.

V. COMMENTS OF PREPARING OFFICER: It is quite possible that the object sighted by Mrs. [REDACTED] and the H-13 helicopter are one and the same. The helicopter, piloted by 1/Lt Robert Bowler, departed from Ft. San Houston at 25/1750Z Nov 54 with an ETA of 25/1805Z Nov 54. However, due to unknown circumstances, the pilot's ATA was 25/1820Z Nov 54. Fort San Houston is an Army Base located in the Northeast sector of San Antonio, Texas, approximately 8 Nautical Miles from Kelly AFB.

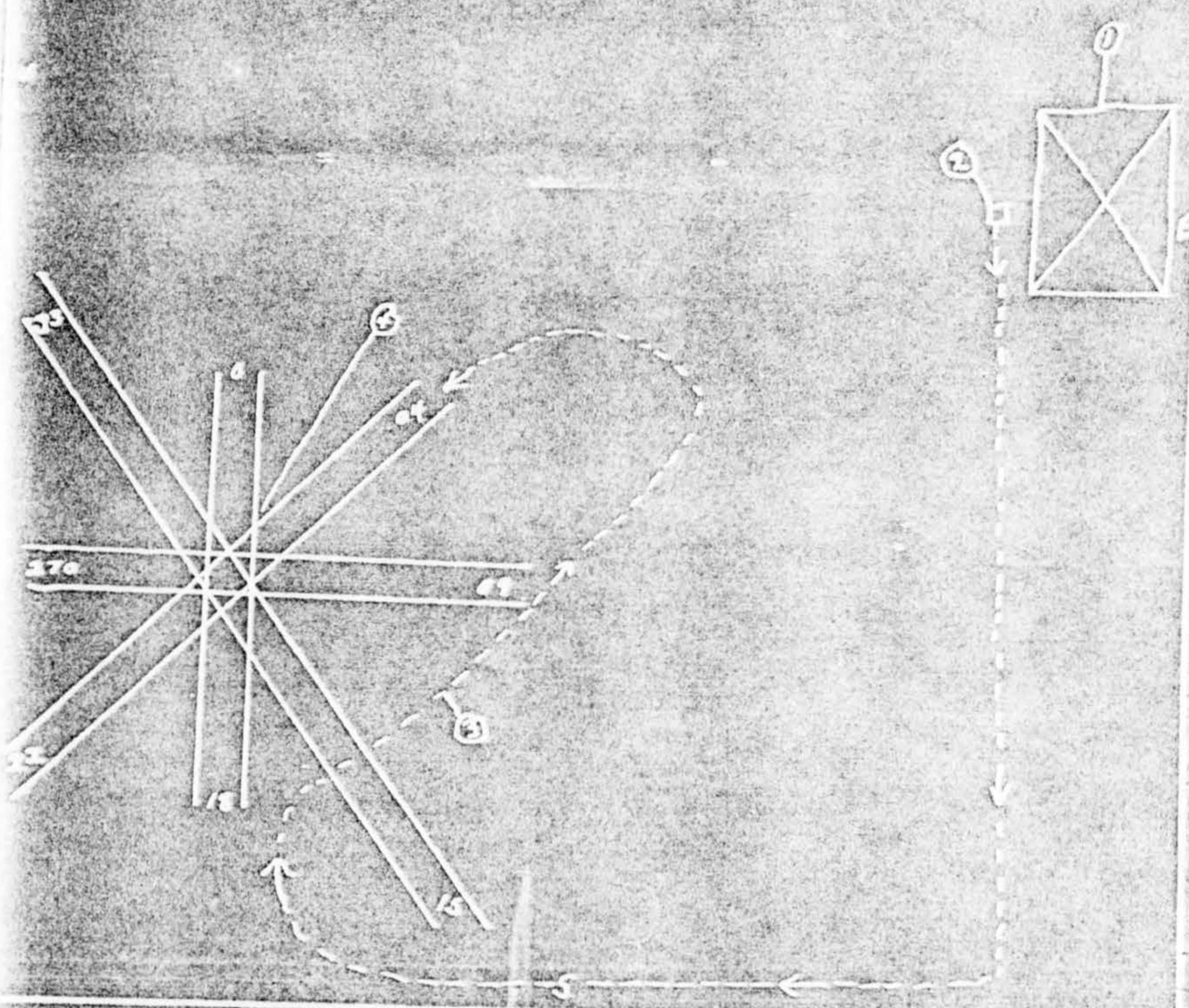

The surface winds from 0 to 6,000 feet were from 240° at 10 knots and
was that the direction of traffic at Kelly AFB, Texas would be southeasterly.

Helicopters fly a normal aircraft traffic pattern at Kelly AFB, and it is
quite possible that the helicopter flew over the Quinn residence either during
take-off or entering traffic. The time of the sighting and the time the helicopter
was aloft are approximately the same. The fact that Mrs. Quinn stated that the
object remained suspended for some length of time also gives the investigator a
clue that it was probably a helicopter. SOURCE stated that the object was flying
into the sun part of the time, and therefore, the object could have been quite
deceiving. The bubble of the H-13 helicopter is quite large, and therefore it is
possible that the SOURCE saw the helicopter when the sun was reflecting off the
rotor hub. The preparing Officer believes the Helicopter and the UH-1B to be the
same.

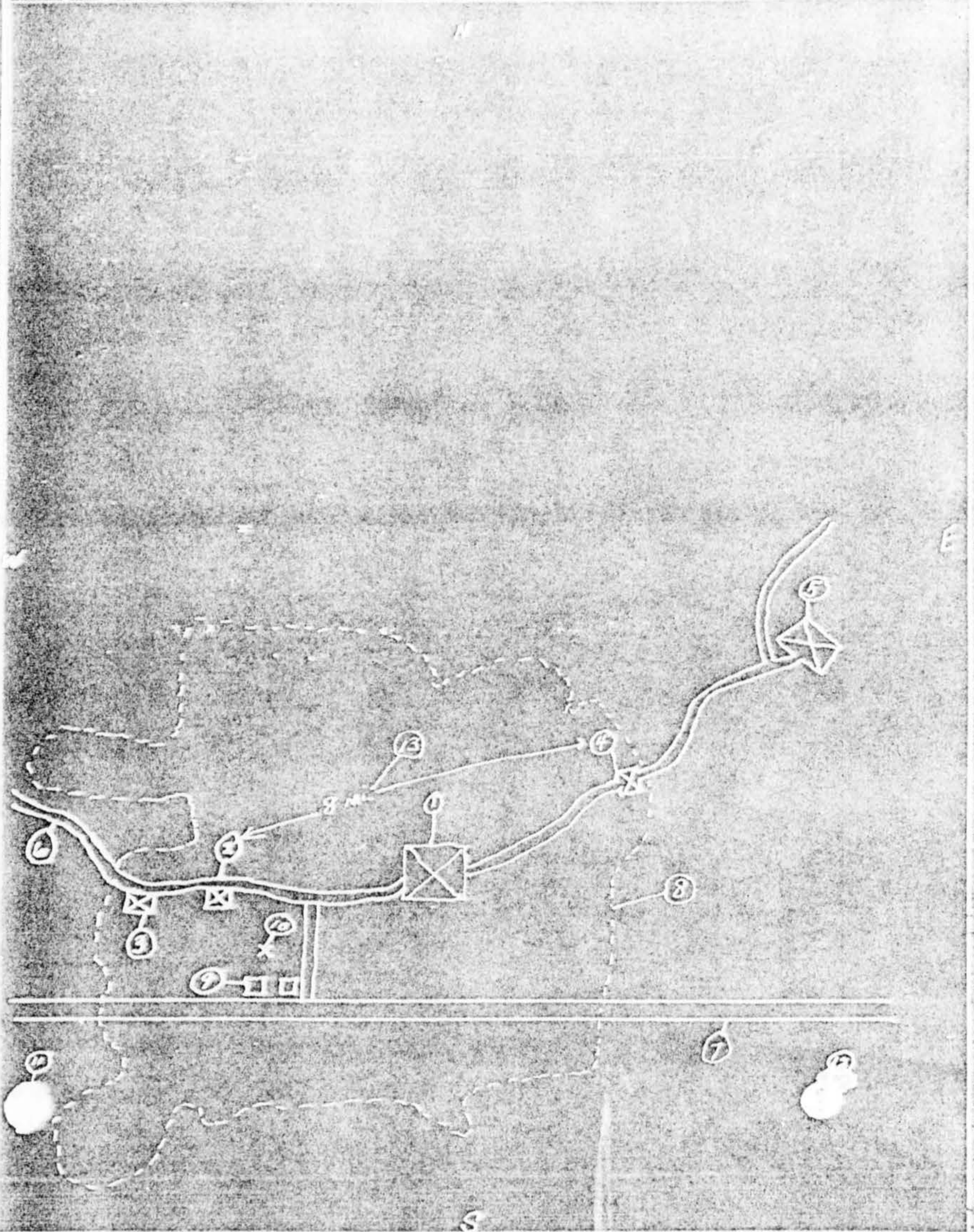

II. RELIABILITY: SOURCE was questioned while working in the Sears Roebuck Department Store. She was very friendly, congenial, and quite willing to cooperate in every way. SOURCE was in charge of the women's clothing department, so she took sufficient time off for the questioning and to fill out the questionnaire. Details of the Sighting were distinctly clear in the SOURCE's mind.

III. SOURCE'S DESCRIPTION OF OBJECT:

1. SOURCE was standing in the back yard of her Sister-in-law's residence located two miles South of Military Drive on Palo Alto Drive, South San Antonio, Texas (GEORGE FHGO 2323). On the 25th day of Nov. 1954 at 1805Z SOURCE was accompanied by her husband, [REDACTED], age 29, her brother-in-law, [REDACTED], age 33, and his wife [REDACTED], age 33, and three children who also sighted the object. Mr. and [REDACTED] reside at [REDACTED]. Object appeared to be solid and grayish-white in color. Object moved from South to a southeasterly direction. It first appeared to remain suspended for approximately three minutes, and then progressed in a Southeasterly direction out of sight. It maintained a straight and level trajectory at an approximate speed of 75 MPH. Reference Incl #1, Report 20-UF08-4, SOURCE's sketch of sighting.

2. On the day of Sighting sky was perfectly clear with 15 miles visibility.

3. Object remained suspended for a period of three minutes and did not show any evidence of exhaust or any other method of propulsion.

4. SOURCE stated the object was grayish-white in color and completely absent of sound.

5. Object did not make any action such as changing shape or flickering.
6. Object was judged to be approximately 5,000 to 7,000 feet altitude, and appeared to be brighter than the background of the sky. It appeared to be approximately the size of a small aircraft and was observed for a period of 10 minutes.
7. SOURCE stated that she thought the object first to be a balloon, but closer observation indicated that it was not similar to any known object such as aircraft. SOURCE stated that her husband immediately notified Kelly AFB and received negative results.

IV. INVESTIGATOR'S SUMMARY:

1. A check was made with the following agencies with the indicated results:

- a. Randolph AFB Weather Station: No weather balloons were released on 25/1800Z Nov 54. GEORGE of Randolph AFB - PHCQ 4347.
- b. Randolph AFB Air Traffic Section: Negative results.
- c. Kelly AFB MATS Air Traffic and Weather Section: Negative results.
- d. San Antonio Municipal Airport Weather Station (GEORGE PHCQ 3032): Negative results.
- e. Kelly AFB Operations and Air Traffic Section (GEORGE PHCQ 2822): On 25/1750Z Nov 54 a H-13 Helicopter #7956 departed from Ft. Sam Houston for Kelly AFB, Texas. The H-13's ETA was 25/1805Z Nov 54, but the ATA was 25/1820Z Nov 54. Fort Sam Houston is an Army Base located in the North East section of San Antonio, Texas, approximately 8 Nautical miles from Kelly AFB, Texas. Name of the pilot flying the helicopter was 1/Lt Robert Howler. Reference Incl #2, Rept 2D-UPOB-4 for Flight Path of H-13 Helicopter.
- f. An additional contact with Kelly AFB Operations and Air Traffic Section revealed the following aircraft were in the vicinity:
 - (1) T-28 type aircraft, #7599, from James Connally AFB, Waco, Texas flew across San Antonio and landed at Kelly AFB at 25/1826Z Nov 54. Pilot's name: Lt. Hubke.
 - (2) C-47 type aircraft, #9268, departed Kelly AFB at 25/1753Z Nov 54 enroute to James Connally AFB, Waco, Texas.
 - (3) T-6 type aircraft, #1149, departed Kelly AFB on a day local flight. Pilot's name: Lt. Hanna.

V. COMMENTS OF PREPARING OFFICER: It is quite possible that the object sighted by Mrs. [REDACTED] and the H-13 helicopter are one and the same. The helicopter, piloted by 1/Lt Robert Howler, departed from Ft. Sam Houston at 25/1750Z Nov 54 with an ETA of 25/1805Z Nov 54. However, due to unknown circumstances, the pilot's ATA was 25/1820Z Nov 54. Fort Sam Houston is an Army Base located in the Northeast sector of San Antonio, Texas, approximately 8 Nautical Miles from Kelly AFB.

The surface winds from 6 to 6,000 feet were from 240° at 10 knots indicating that the direction of traffic at Kelly AFB, Texas would be Southwesterly.

Helicopters fly a normal aircraft traffic pattern at Kelly AFB, so it is quite possible that the helicopter flew over the [redacted] residence either during takeoff or entering traffic. The time of the sighting and the time the helicopter was aloft are approximately the same. The fact that Mrs. [redacted] stated that the object remained suspended for some length of time also gives the investigator a clue that it was probably a helicopter. SOURCE stated that the object was flying into the sun part of the time, and therefore, the object could have been quite deceiving. The bubble of the H-13 helicopter is quite large, and therefore it is possible that the SOURCE saw the helicopter when the sun was reflecting off the canopy. The preparing Officer believes the Helicopter and the UFO to be the same.

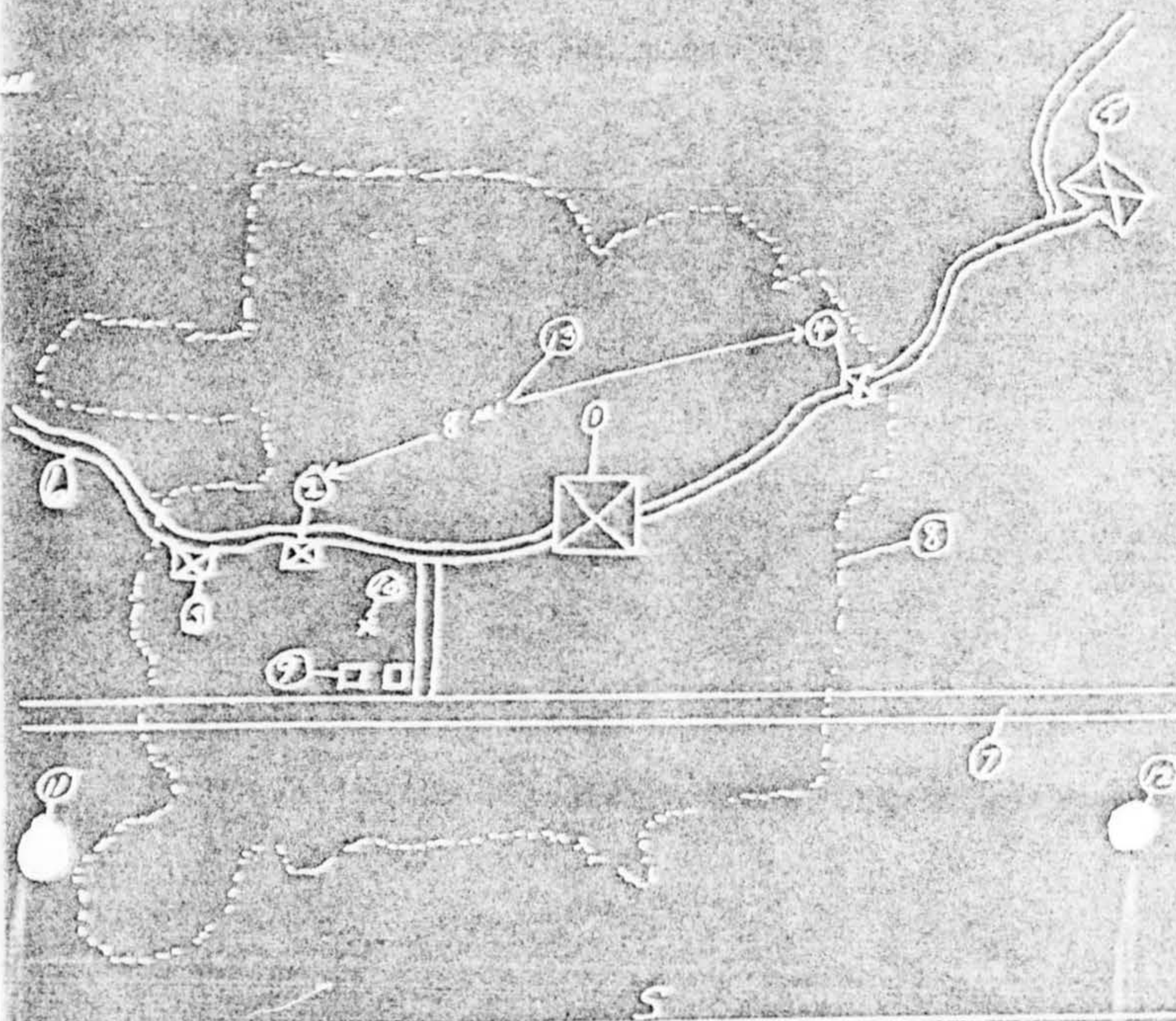
