1.1 The objects sighted on the nights of 15-16 and 20-21 December 1970, and at a large distance to the west of Moscow, have not been identified. The object was bright, glinting dark, about 100-120 m across. It had a dark, rounded, somewhat irregular shape, with a thin, dark, irregular rim. The object moved slowly, and could be observed South or South-East. Its height was about 1200-1500 meters. On the 15-16 October 1971, the object was seen over Moscow.
