

(10) Considerable aircraft activity were departing Hanscom Field between 1500-1700 hours 27 December 1954. Two jet aircraft were active in the Area (F-86 and T-33). T-33 aircraft was shooting touch and go landings on take off Runway 23. This take off flight path crosses Route 2, four miles east of the town of Concord, Mass.

(11) Investigation of all local weather stations did not reveal any abnormal sky conditions. Balloons released at Fort Banks, Winthrop, Mass. 0200Z, 0535Z, 1525Z, 2100Z. The L. G. Hanscom Field CAA Traffic Control Tower operators on duty at the time of the sighting did not notice any low flying aircraft or unusual objects. Possible cause of objects is undetermined by reporting officer.
