

The following extracts are taken from the 1000 (com) (unclassified) (SAC)
Center) 29th AD (Det), Great Falls AFB, Montana.

- 0125Z: AFM 75000 saw multiple local flash explosions reported at 0110Z. Explosions were 2 miles south and 1 mile west of Great Falls, Montana. AFM believed 75161. Time of explosion was 0112Z.
- 0130Z: RCC issued more information on explosion. From 10 [REDACTED] at 0100Z. His telephone number is Roman 8-0114. [REDACTED]
- 0340Z: Additional information on explosion from [REDACTED] [REDACTED] force the 1000 to take the road to the south. The tanks were stopped and moved westward. Tanks from the 1000 and 6000 [REDACTED] 6000 of Camp Colter were engaged to assist 0100Z. He received calls at 1430Z AFM 75161 and 1435Z AFM 75161. Both communications were [REDACTED]
- 0420Z: [REDACTED] 75161 reported Camp Colter had been hit by an explosion, but it didn't hurt anyone. Estimated radius of explosion to be 40,000 yards and damage to be 1000 yards between 0300-0315 18Z.
- 0525Z: Report of 75161 (AFM) claimed he had taken route 1000 (Spokane) north and was stopped by tanks coming from the south. One tank (from Camp Colter, 1000) from 0100Z to 0500Z was driving 1000 (Spokane) toward him and the tanks were stopped in same position of Camp Colter 1800-1815 18Z.
- 0640Z: Backlog 0100Z. Russian missile operation 1000 (Spokane) north to 1000 (Colter). (P/B) An unlocated missile was shot down near Spokane (AFM) 1000 (Spokane) 1000 (Colter) reported on metes. Approximately 100 miles south. Report of second or third missile appeared 0115-0200Z after first explosion.
- 1220Z: Contact with 1000 (Colter) reported no damage to 0100Z. They reported no 75161 damage. 0100Z reported no damage to 0100Z.


