10. Inc: 1 AACO and Base Operations report that there were no aircraft in the area of concern during the time observation was made.

a. As a result of the interview and interpretation of the observers named in para 6b, it is my opinion that an unusual flying object was seen by both men. There was no indication that either party possessed a high degree of imagination or tendency to exaggerate or fabricate the data submitted. Due to the unexpected appearance of the object(s) and the short time observed, the accuracy of the descriptive data is somewhat questionable.

b. Preliminary investigation with AWS and Control Tower agencies give no indication that the observation made was caused by scheduled aircraft or weather phenomena.
