Mr. Overstreet, a career man at the U.S. Naval Supply Depot, San Diego, California, several times during his service as a member between 1943-8 and 1945-8, and especially one night in 1945, suspended in the air from 400 to 2400 feet above the ground, at every interval each time he reached 1000 ft. It is believed that the reason Mr. Overstreet had either planned or was ordered to do this, is because he had been informed by someone that the Japanese were planning to drop incendiary bombs on the city of San Diego, and that he was to be prepared to help put out the fires.

1.1. **Background:** SOURCE was a female who was performing night work at [REDACTED] Site C, [REDACTED] and experienced low-level EMF exposure during her employment. SOURCE stated that she had been working there for approximately 10 years and that she had never experienced any adverse health effects due to the EMF exposure. She stated that she had no knowledge of any other workers who had experienced adverse health effects due to the EMF exposure. She was asked if she had any agreements made with the government regarding compensation or protection of her health. SOURCE stated that she had no such agreements.

1.2. **SOURCE's Description of Incident (Interviewed):**

1. SOURCE went to her place of work from her home at 10:30 p.m. on 10 September 1998.

2. **Object #1:** On several occasions (approximately 10) between 10:30 p.m. and 11:30 p.m. between 1995 and 1997, SOURCE observed a bright blue light in the sky that was sometimes to the west, sometimes north and to the south of SOURCE's position. The object seemed to be between 500 to 2000 feet above and about twice as big as the moon. The object usually appeared between 0300 and 0500 hours. Sometimes the object was stationary and other times it moved across the north-south axis of the townsite. SOURCE used an ordinary two-cell flashlight and infrared night vision goggles to view the object and stated that the object was visible to her naked eye. A vibration of the object caused motion sickness. SOURCE stated that the object blazed a trail of light behind it and that the object's color was very reddish and yellowish orange. SOURCE initially saw the message "I come here" in the light and stated that the message was blanked in before SOURCE first saw the message. SOURCE stated that she approached the object and took a look at it. The object did not move, it just glowed and disappeared. SOURCE said that she could see the heat signature of the object. SOURCE never used binoculars to observe the object.

3. **Object #2:** Approximately 10:30 p.m. on 10 September 1998 SOURCE was observing Object #1. At 10:45 p.m. SOURCE observed a bright blue light in the east. SOURCE stated that the object was bright orange and SOURCE could see three red lights around the object. SOURCE stated that the object moved at a constant speed of 100 miles per hour. SOURCE blazed a trail of light behind it. SOURCE stated that the object was very large and then the object made sharp right turns and came over SOURCE's head. The object then descended and to the north. The object measured approximately 10'x10'x10'. At 10:45 p.m. SOURCE said that there were about 500 feet above SOURCE. SOURCE stated that the object was moving slowly and again the object began to turn until the object disappeared to the horizon.


