ADOAO 135. CIRVIS UFOS. A. PILOT'S STATEMENT: AT 30/4/55 1237 JUST EAST CVQH SAW LIGHT ABOUT SIZE OF A QUARTER 5 DEG TO THE RIGHT OF COURSE 338 DEG MAG. WHITE LIGHT MOMENTARILY TURNED BLUE AND BACK TO WHITE. SEEMED LIKE IT FIGHT BY BEACON. IT LIT UP THE SKY ABOUT 1 INCH (WHICH WOULD BE 2 DEG ABOVE HORIZON). ASKED 221ST AW SQ. SYDNEY, N.S., IF THEY HAD OBJECT ON WEAPON. NEGATIVE REPORT. FIRST IMPRESSION IT FIGHT PT ABOUT 15 MILES FROM A/C DOING 400M. NO CLOSURE. OBJECT ROSE ABOVE THE HORIZON FROM 12 TO 15 INCHES, 7-8 DEG ABOVE HORIZON COLOR OR SHAPE DID NOT CHANGE. SUN CAME UP OBJECT STILL THERE. USED BINOCULARS. WAS NOT ROUND IN SENSE OF A CIRCLE-WAS ROUND IN THE SENSE THAT IT HAD DEFINITE EDGES IN FRONT OF A CIRCLE. SEEMED AS THOUGHT YOU COULD SEE THROUGH IT AT FIRST - SEEMED AS THOUGHT IT WAS PUMPING. VARIED IN

POSITION FRO 1 O'CLOCK TO 2:30 AND BACK. WENT UP AND ACROSS AND NEVER BELOW THE HORIZON. END OF STATEMENT. B. FOLLOWING WAS CALLED TO 4TH AT 217 AICC FROM TCAF NO. 2 ADCC, CHATHAM, N.B. AT 30/4/55 1237 TCAF REPORT FROM PILOT AF 29783, T-33 TUE CEF TO CVJT. POSITION WOULD SAY AT 1 O'CLOCK FROM PILOT AND SEEMED TO STAY IN THAT RELATIVE POSITION, HE TRIED TO CLOSE ON OBJ BUT IT WENT AWAY MAINTAINING

NEVER BELOW THE HORIZON. END OF STATEMENT. D. FOLLOWING WAS CALLED TO 64TH AIR DIV ADCC FROM PCAF NO. 2 ADCC, CHATHAM, N.B. AT 30/111457 REC'D REPORT FROM PILOT AF 29783, T-33 ENR CEF TO CVJT. POSITION WIND 004°. SAW LIGHT CHANGING COLOR. VARYING FROM FLUO TO WHITE. HAD APPEARANCE OF FLAVING GAS. APPEARED FAIRLY LARGE. VERY HIGH SPEED. OPJ STATED AT 1 O'CLOCK FROM PILOT AND STATED TO STAY IN THAT RELATIVE POSITION, HE TRIED TO CLOSE ON OPJ BUT IT WENT AWAY MAINTAINING RELATIVE POSITION FOR 30 MINUTES FOLLOWED HIM TO CVJT. A/C HDS 745 DEG TRUE. 221 AM SQ, SYDNEY, N.S., STATES THAT FLIP APPEARED ON WEAPON FOR 2 SWEEPS 1 MILE SOUTH OF SAME A/C. C. A/C FLYING AT 35 THOUSAND FEET. WEATHER AT ALT CLEAR WIND 270 DEG 40K TEMP - 50 DEG C. UNDERCAST 15 THOUSAND FEET. D. NO UNUSUAL ACTIVITY OF A METEOROLOGICAL OR ASTRONOMICAL NATURE. E. NO PHYSICAL EVIDENCE. F. NO INTERCEPT OR IB ACTION TAKEN OTHER THAN STATED IN A. ABOVE. G. NO OTHER KNOWN TRAFFIC IN AREA. H. PREPARING OFFICER. SENIOR DUTY CONTROLLER, 64TH AIR DIV ADCC. DID NOT PERSONALLY INTERVIEW PILOT. FROM EVIDENCE GIVEN ABOVE, OPJ MIGHT POSSIBLY BE RISING PLANET.
