However, no further evidence was later recovered.			11. COMMENTS The intelligence officer of the 648th AC&W Squadron stated that there were twelve other persons present at the time of the supposed sighting, but they reportedly saw nothing unusual. For this reason the report is strongly suggestive of an optical illusion.
