II. SUMMARY: The unidentified flying object was sighted by SOURCE while on duty at a GOC post at Poulsbo, Washington, (GEOREF DKNC 2143) at 22/0845Z June 55. The sighting was made in a south westernly direction or from the Seattle, Washington area. Information contained in this report was gleaned from the preliminary report and telephone conversations.

II. RELIABILITY: The source was not contacted and reliability cannot be determined from information contained in the preliminary report.

III. SOURCES DESCRIPTION OF SIGHTING:

1. Source described the object as being oval in shape and one-half inch in diameter
2. Three lights were sighted which flashed on and off from rosy pink to blue and back again. There were two small and one large light.
3. The object appeared to bounce up and down.
4. The weather conditions were clear with unlimited ceiling and visibility. The sighting was made with the naked eye and the length of time observed was one hour.

SUPPLEMENTAL INVESTIGATION EFFORTS:

1. A check with McChord Flight Operations was made by Flt 1-A, 4602d AISS for aircraft in the area at the time of the sighting and none were present at the time of the sighting.

2. A check with the 4770th Ground Observer Sq resulted in no further amplifying details on the sighting.

3. A check with the 635th AC&W Sq resulted in negative leads.

4. A telephone call was placed to the Sandpoint Naval Air Station, Seattle, Washington (GEOREF DKNC 4232) and the following information was received:

a. A weather balloon was released from Sandpoint NAS at 22/0831Z June 55.

b. Winds at that time were as follows:

COMMENTS OF PREPARING OFFICER:

1. The opinion of the preparing officer is that the sighting was probably caused by the Sandpoint NAS weather balloon for the following reasons:

a. The duration of the sighting, one hour, points out that the object was not self propellant, and no aircraft were reported in the air, including helicopters.

b. The balloon released at 0831Z with the prevailing winds from 140-270 degrees would project the balloon in the general direction of Poulsbo, Washington.

c. The wind variations in velocity and direction at various altitudes would create an appearance of bouncing of the object as SOURCE reported.

d. The balloon was reported to have been aloft for one hour and thirty minutes which would cover the duration of the sighting.
