



JUST AFTER WE TURNED TO THAT HEADING LT SCHNECK MADE HIS REPT OF THE OBJECT AND I LOOKED OVER WHEN HE CALLED IT IN AND THOUGHT THAT IT WOULD HELP IF I VERIFIED WHAT HE SAW BECAUSE I SAW THE SAME THING AT APPRX THE SAME POSITION. ENRAGE IDENTIFIED BOTH OF US BY OUR PARROTT. ENRAGE DETERMINED THAT I WAS APPRX 7 MILES CLOSER TO THE OBJECT SO HE HAD ME GIVE CHANGE. BECAUSE THE SUN WAS DIRECTLY IN FRONT OF US. AS THE SUN ROSE HIGHER, UNCLASSIFIED THE LIGHT BEGAN TO GET DIMMER AND DIMMER UNTIL WE COMPLETELY LOST SIGHT. IF WE HAD NOT SEEN THE MOVEMENTS OF THE OBJECT, WE WOULD HAVE THOUGHT IT WAS ONLY A BRIGHT STAR, BUT THE DEFINITE HORIZONTAL AND VERTICAL MOVEMENTS OF THE OBJECT KILLED THAT BELIEF.
