- II. RELIABILITY: Poor. During a personal interview, Mr. Delong spoke of having once reported a sighting which turned out to be a pelican flying over. He seemed to be ancitable and placed importance on reporting everything without enough forethought, as was evident in errors in giving observation time and size of object in his original report.
- Observation Post at the time of the sighting (090615Z July 55).

 The night was clear, dark, dry and cool, with a slight breeze blowing. There was no moon and many stars were out. A single object was observed for a period of three (3) to four (4) seconds. This is contrary to Source's original report, which stated that it was a 30 second sighting.
 - A. The object did not appear to stand still nor suddenly speed up and rush away at any time. The object faded out at its disappearance. The object appeared overhead at approximately 70 to 80 degrees from the horizon to the north, and traveled to the north, fadeing out of view at 60 to 70 degrees, not behind any object.
 - B. Source changed the original estimate of size in his initial report from that of a silver dollar to that of a dime held in the hand at arms' length. Source does not wear glasses and did not use any visual aids for this sighting.
 - C. Source believed this sighting to be a meteor.
