- II. RELIABILITY: Source appeared to be sober, conscientious, and cooperative. Source's GOC supervisor affirmed these indications.
- III. SOURCES DESCRIPTION OF SIGHTING:
1. Source described object as being a round, white light the size of a pinhead held at arm's length.
 2. Object moved erratically laterally and horizontally.
 3. Source stated that object definitely moved in reference to a known, stationary object. Object was observed to move approximately 30 degrees across the big dipper.
 4. Source associated movement of object with intensity of light. Light appeared to intensify when object moved and grow dim when object was motionless.
 5. This was a night sighting observed for 15 minutes.
 6. Weather conditions were clear and unlimited.

SUPPLEMENTAL INVESTIGATIVE EFFORTS:

1. The 635th AC&W Sq at McChord AFB was unable to furnish any information on the sighting.
2. There are no facilities available to Flight 1-A for checking on astronomical data.
3. A check with Sandpoint NAS at Seattle, Washington, the only agency in this area that launches balloons, revealed that no such object from their station could have been in the area of Bellingham at the time of the sighting. A balloon released at 04/0231Z Sept 1955 could not have been in the Bellingham area because prevailing winds were from the north and would have put the balloon far to the south of the sighting.
