SUPPLEMENTAL INVESTIGATIVE EFFORTS:

- 1. The 635th AC&W So at McChord AFB was unable to furnish any information on the sighting.
- 2. There are no facilities available to Flight 1-A for checking on astronomical data.
- 3. A check with Sandpoint NAS at Seattle, Washington, the only agency in this area that launches balloons, revealed that no such object from their station could have been in the area of Bellingham at the time of the sighting. A balloon released at 04/0231Z Sept 1955 could not have been in the Bellingham area because prevailing winds were from the north and would have put the balloon far to the south of the sighting.
