<p>1. Report of sighting an unidentified object submitted by Mr. [REDACTED], Army Map Service, [REDACTED], Washington, D. C.</p> <p>2. Mr. [REDACTED] reported that three of his fellow workers sighted an illuminated object, appearing approximately the size of a silver dollar. The object seemed to glow and was round in nature. There was no sound.</p> <p>3. The object was first seen when one of the three men was tossing up a coin while waiting for the coffee mobile. As the man looked up for the coin he sighted the object and told the other two men to look. The flight path of the object was like an arc in the sky. The object disappeared over the Dalecarlia Reservoir. The total time of sighting was about one (1) minute.</p> <p>4. The manner of observation was ground to air, and visual.</p> <p>5. The date was 7 September 1955 at 1130Z. It was late afternoon.</p> <p>6. The location of observers was from the grounds of the Army Map Service, located at [REDACTED], Washington, D. C.</p> <p>7. Identifying information of the observers is as follows: Mr. [REDACTED], address [REDACTED], Silver Springs, Maryland, occupation is that of a Plate maker for maps. Reliability is unknown. Mr. [REDACTED], address [REDACTED], Washington, D. C. N.W. occupation is photographer. Reliability is unknown. Mr. [REDACTED], address [REDACTED], Kensington, Maryland, occupation is color photographer. Reliability is unknown.</p> <p>8. Weather conditions at the time of the sighting were described by the observers as very good, ceiling high, visibility was clear, no cloud cover, and there were no thunder storms in the area. There was almost no wind at the time, and no unusual conditions were observed which might account for the sighting. Winds for the 7 Sep 55 Suf, 330-10K; 5000, 300-15K; 10,000, 280-20K; 18,000, 290-25K; 25,000, 270-29K; 30,000 260-41K; 50,000, 260-35K; 80,000, 160-1K.</p> <p>9. There was no air traffic in the vicinity at the time of sighting.</p> <p>10. No explanation to the cause of the sighting can be given. No further action in regard to this sighting is presently contemplated.</p>
