

II. RELIABILITY: SOURCE was a very quiet and timid person. She had recently undergone a heart operation and was not in very good health. She is under the influence of her mother, and tends to believe what her mother believes. It is considered that the information contained in this report is made up largely of the information she heard from her mother rather than that of herself. It is therefore the opinion of this investigator that the information is not reliable.

III. SOURCE'S DESCRIPTION OF SIGHTING:

- 1. SCHOOL was visiting her mother at B. Ohio (GJHM 5902) when a phone call from Mr. It also of the sky. Time of call was 23/03152 Sept 55. SOURCE saw the object in question in the South East at a bearing of 135° and 60° azimuth.
- 2. At the same time, a searchlight beacon, which was identified as from the Akron Airport (GJJM 2104) by SOURCE's mother, was visible. SOURCE said the beacon was thorough lights on the scattered clouds and haze in the vicinity in which it was rotating. Bearing of the beacon was 90° with an azimuth of 20°.
- 3. SOURCE returned into the house after only a few minuted as she was not in good health. While she observed the object, it appeared to move slowly West. During her sighting, she heard two faint explosions accompanied with a bright exhaust from the object. No other sounds were heard.
- 4. SOURCE stated object was round and sharply outlined with a red color. Size was about that of a grapefruit held at arm's length. No estimate of its size speed or altitude could be given due to lack of reference point.
- 5. At the time of the sighting, the weather was dry and cool with no wind and scattered clouds and haze. Only a few stars were visible and the moon was not in sight.

II. RELIABILITY: SOURCE was very pleasant and earnest, cooperating in every way. He stated he was still very interested in the Air Force and did a great deal of reading to keep up on the latest developments. His manner reflected his intelligence. He is well respected throughout the community. The information contained in this report is considered accurate to the best of the SOURCE's ability, however, it is further believed it is a miscenception of a known object.

III. SOURCE'S DESCRIPTION OF SIGHTING:

- 1. SOUPCE was walking from his garage to his home after returning from work. Looking into the sky Eastward, he noticed a light on a bearing of 95° and a szimuth of 45°. Time was 0300 Zebra hours 23 Sept 55 (2200 hours 22 Sept 55 EDST). At first SCURCE thought object was a searchlight beacon, but after watching for several minutes, came to the conclusion that it was a flying object unidentifiable to him. At 0315 Zebra hours 23 Sept 55 (2215 hours 22 Sept 55 EDST) he called Mrs. Rose M. Presznick, who is the local GOC Observer, and reported the object to her for her collaboration.
- 2. The object was following a circular pattern, emerging from out of a haze in the East and disappearing into the haze again in the South East. SOURCE watched the object for a total of 45 minutes. The pattern object followed was regular and took one (1) minute and Tifteen (15) seconds for each revolution.
- 3. The night was described as hazy in the East with scattered clouds overhead. No wind was evident and it was warm and dry with no trace of daylight.
- 4. Sound of the object was described as more like that of a rocket as opposed to that of a jet. Color was blue gray center with bright white fringe. When first sighted, the outline was sharp, but became fuzzy before disappearing. SCURCE stated this could be because of the increase in the haze coverage.
- 5. Several times during sighting, SOURCE saw another, smaller object flying near the larger object. It appeared to him as if the smaller we ject was attempting to make contact with the larger. No increase in sound was evident when both objects were in view. Color of the smaller was the same as the larger.
- 6. During the time of the sighting, SOURCE saw and heard a aircraft pass over from the East to the South West. He said he could definitely recognize it as a conventional type aircraft as he was used to seeing them often. He believes the town of Lodi is on a course of a regular airlines.
- 7. Unknown object appeared as large as a basketball and was estimated as 20 feet in diameter, traveling at 400 miles per hour. SOURCE could not



SUPPLEMENTARY INVESTIGATIVE EFFORTS:

- 1. A check with the Akron Municipal Airport at Akron, Ohio revealed the following information:
- dawn on 22-23 Sept 1955. This beacon operates during these hours throughout the year. Revolutions per minute of the beacon is six (6).
- b. Two (2) searchlights, sixty (60) inch, arc, were operating during the evening of 22 Sept 1955. One located approximately eight hundred (800) feet from the boundary of the airport to the West (see incl. #1) and another about one half (1) mile to the West of the airport (see incl. #1). These were being used for advertising purposes of a Gas Filling Station and a County Fair respectively. Revolutions of these searchlights very slow.
 - c. It was also beerned that the Columbia Chemical Works in Barberton, Ohio (see incl. # 1), between Lodi and Akron pours chemicals into "settling beds" which take in an area of several acres. The clouds coming off of these beds are known locally ks the Barberton Front. This mass of clouds, mist and/or haze has been seen to rise at times, to an altitude of 30,000 feet. It definitly influences the visibility of the Akron Airport at times. These cloud formations have been responsible for many at ange phenomena in the past; causing reflections onthe clouds from the beds and other light sources.



COMMENTS OF PREPARING OFFICER:

- 1. It is the opinion of the Preparing Officer that the objects seen by the observers can be resolved as known objects for the following reasons:
- a. In the case of the sighting by ROSE M. PRESZNICK and ELAINE M. MONACHINO there were two objects observed. One a known object and the other unknown. The known object was that of a searchlight projecting light on the overcest to the East of them. The unknown object was described to the investigator rather vaguely. The direction of travel was Westerly from the South East to the South West. Sound of the object was faint and steady with the exception of "two explosions like that of a firecracker." Even the sounds of the "explosions" were very faint. It is therefore considered that she cannot be absolutely sure they didn't come from another source, possibly on the ground. A possible, and more logical explanation is considered the resolution of the sighting and became apparent during the conversation with JOSEPH F. LEATHERMAN.

also two objects seen. One a known and the other unknown. The known object was that of an aircraft passing overhead from the East to the South West. Direction of travel was West by South West. Altitude was high but the sound was still distinguishable to him, possibly due to his Air Force experience. It seems that this is the UNOS reported by ROSE M. PRESZNICK. The unknown object in this case, was described circling in a very definite pattern. Although Mr. LEATHERMAN was certain that it object was an air vehicle of some sort, it seems that he was mistaken as all evidence as received from MRS PRESZNICK and the Akron Airport point to the fact that what was actually seen was a light from a searchlight beacon projected on the overcast.

II. RELIABILITY: SOURCE was a pleasant woman, very friendly and anxious to cooperate; well-known throughout the surrounding community and well respected. SOURCE had made sightings on three previous occasions; at these time she was not a member of the COC and was reluctant to report them for fear of ridicule. Although SOURCE was intelligent and talked with assurance, it is the opinion of this investigator that she is prone to let herself imagine she sees things other than what is actually before her. The information contained in this report is considered to be unraliable.

III. SOURCE'S DESCRIPTION OF SIGHTING:

- 1. SOURCE recieved a cell from Mr. at 23/0315Z Sept 55 requesting she look into the South East sector of the sky to confirm his sighting of an unidentified flying object. SOURCE complied and saw the object.
- 2. Object was on a bearing of approximately 135° with an azimuth of approximately 60°. At the same time, SOURCE recognized the searchlight beacon from the Akron Airport(GJJM 2104) about 30 miles East of SOURCE'S location. The beacon was rotating in a counter-clock-wise direction and castin reflections on the clouds and haze in the area.
- 3. The object was in view for a period of 25 minutes during which time it traveled from the South East to the South West where it suddenly disappeared. On two occasions during its flight, SOURCE heard a faint explosion, as that of a firecracker, and simultaneously observed a bright orangeish-blue exhaust from the object.
- 4. The night was dry with no moon. Scatterred clouds in the vicinity and haze obscured about one-fourth of the sky. No ground wind was noticed. Only a few stars were in evidence.
- 5. SOURCE heard only a faint whirring sound other than the explosions. She could not estimate the speed nor the altitude as there was no point to use as a reference. The object appeared round at first, assuming an eliptical shape as it continued on its course. During sighting, the object appeared about the size of a grapefruit held at arms length.
- 6. The object had a blue-gray color with the edges much brighter than the center. SOURCE stated she had never seen anything before that gave the same appearance. When investigator described a jet aircraft cutting in its after-burners, SOURCE seemed this was not what she had seen.
