SUMMARY OF INFORMATION

The following report was received at 2018 hours, 23 February 56, by the First Army Staff Duty Officer, by an individual identifying himself as _____ or of the NY Journal American.

1. A Sgt George PIERCE, further identifying data unknown, but believed to be a member of the U.S.Army, was walking a dog near his mother's residence on _____ in Bklyn, NY at approximately 2000 hours, 23 Feb 56. Sgt PIERCE was on leave at the time.
2. Sgt PIERCE heard a noise as from an airplane in trouble and, upon looking up, saw a round, big, blue fluorescent lighted object in the sky, which went in the direction of Idlewild Airport, circled the airport, and then left in the direction of lower New York. Sgt PIERCE described this object as a flying saucer.
3. The caller described Sgt PIERCE as apparently rational and sober and added that the Sgt was due to go overseas in the near future.
