8. APPROX 4 MINUTES AFTER LEVERL OFF AT 30,500 FT ON A HEADING OF 070 DEGREES THE A/C ANNOUNCED OVER INTERPHONE AN ACFT HIGHT AT TEN O' CLOCK. WATCHED IT FOR SEVERAL SECONDS AS IT WAS APPROACHING FROM THE EAST WHEN I REALIZED IT WAS NOT AN ORDINARZ ACFT. IT APPEARED TO BE 2-3 MILES TO MY LEFT AND 2 TO 5,000 KT ABOVE. AT THIS TIME THE OBSERVER SAW IT PASS FROM HIN NINE O' CLOCK POSITION AND DISAPPEAR OUT OF HIS VISION APPROX SEVEN 9' CLOCK. PILOT AND CO-PILOT BOTH OBSERVED IT FOR APPROX SIXTY SECONDS UNTIL IT DISAPPERED BEHIND US. BOTH PILOTS ESTIMATED IT TO BE TRAVELLING AT 500-600 KNOTS. IT WAS ROUND IN SHAPE AND BRIGHT BLUE IN COLOR, IT WAS TRAILING HEAVY YELLOW-ORANGE SMOKE AND SPARKS. THE OVERALL SHAPE OR SILOUETTE WAS TEARDROP AND IT WAS MOVING IN LEVEL FLIGHT. THE OBSERVER BEST COMPARED IT TO V-2 ROCKETS HE SAW DURING WW II. THE CO- PILOT TURNED IN HIS SEAT AS FAR AS POSSIBLE AND SAID IT LOOKED ALMOST LIKE LOOKING IN THE END OF A TAIL SECTION AS IT PROGRESSED AWAY FROM US.
