In Gir Rais On 6 April 1956 the local press carried an article stating that a mysterious flying object had flown over the city of Casahlanea. The press article further stated that the object was luminous with a flery yellow color, appeared in the east and appeared to pross over the city at a low altitude, turning at the same time, and disappeared a few amounts later in a Southeasterly direction.

2. CESE VER NO. 1. The object was reported by M. Tahiri, an employee at the local ments paper LA VICIE, who describes the object as follows (enclosure (1) to reference (a)):

Dearriction of object:

- as Pound or slightly oval shapes
- b. Size unknown.
- o. Yellow, flary color.
- d. One in nucher.
- e, Not applicable,
- f, There may have been annealisty something below the bright object that was part of it.
- g. There was no tail or trail.
- h. There was no sound.

Description of course of object:

- a. The observer first noticed the object because of its brightness.
- b. Object was first observed in the east and observer states it had an altitude of 2,000 3,000 meters.
- o. Object maintained its altitude throughout sighting.
- d. Object had a straight flight at a very low speed; however, observer further states object circled the city and disappeared toward the southeast (approximately Cases Airport direction).
- e. Object disappeared behind a sloud.
- fo Object was in view during 2 or 3 minutes.

As I was about to open the gate to the house, I looked at the sky and one smething like a round flary ball, an orange color, bluish on the size. This issued for only a few seconds. It was travelling esstewant (on a perpendicular both rue Mangin) and in a trajectory that seemed to take it toward the sea. I took it for granted and this was a metawrite."

CAMENT: The locations of the two observers was separated by a distance of approximately one wire. Theorem No. 1 (M. Tahiri) would have had more epportunity to keep the object in unclustrated view for a longer period of time than observer No. 2.
