1. In accordance with paragraph 906 of JSAF Interim Change 1 to COMSEC 55-1, 15 February 1956, the following report of unidentified flying objects is made. This unit is not presently in possession of AF Forms 112 and 112a, so, for this report the format indicated in cited reference will be used.

a. Description of the object:

- (1) Shape: Undefined because of small size.
- (2) Size: Head of pin. I questioned whether or not it could be a bright star.
- (3) Color: Metallic gray.
- (4) Number: 1
- (5) W/A

- (8) No sound.
- (9) I wore polaroid sun glasses which improved contrast of object against sky.

b. Description of course of object:

- (1) As B-36 passed I watched it. This attracted my attention to the area where I noticed the object.
- (2) Elevation approximately  $40^{\circ}$  to  $45^{\circ}$ ; azimuth about  $10^{\circ}$  to  $15^{\circ}$  east of true north.
- (3) Same location.
- (4) Practically no travel. I referred position to nearby trees.

(5) I stopped watching to go into my house for binoculars. I was unable to relocate the object.

(6) I watched it continuously for about one minute. I relocated it three or four times for shorter intervals.
