Sept. 8 - 56Saturday 25th

It was in early evening on a clear warm day in August. I was sitting on our breezeway in back of our house, looking out towards the garden and highway. Suddenly, from behind some tree in front of me and to my right, appeared ^{in the sky} a bright, bullet-shaped object trailing a long tail of what seemed to be sparks and smoke. I thought at first someone was sitting off the porch because of the long bright tail but as the object, which was like a bright bar of ~~the~~ neon, continued in a straight course across the sky I realized it was not fire smoke. The thing had no protrusions, like wings, and glowed from end to end with a steady light. did not flash on and off or increase.

The object was long and narrow. Rather like a
cigar wider in center 10

or decrease in brightness. There were a few scattered
clouds and the object passed in front of them.
There was no breeze stirring and every thing was
still so I could have heard any sound but the bright
thing made no noise of any kind. It was real
wonderful to watch it say, it bright and so silent,
across the sky. When I first saw the object I called my
husband and he watched it for a while then went on
with some garden work he was doing. I continued to
follow the thing and even got up and walked
but across the lawn so I could watch it as far
as possible. Only once was it out of my sight when
it passed behind a tall oak on my lawn. Then it
reappeared and I watched until it faded into the
distance. As I often watch the commercial planes
which pass over here daily I could estimate that it
took about the same time for the to pass out of
sight as it takes for the air lines. Even after I
could no longer see the object the big bright trail
could stretch across the sky. As the appeared
around 7:30 P.M. E.D.S. the sun had set but as yet
no stars or moon had appeared. It was the bright
twilight. The thing travelled ⁱⁿ a ^{South} South to a N.E. direction.

This is in reply to your letter of August 28, 1956, concerning your sighting of an Unidentified Flying Object.

We are most certainly still interested in these sightings. Inclosed is a USAF Technical Information Sheet for you to complete regarding the phenomenon you have observed.

Any aerial objects, so long as it remains unidentified, represents a potential threat to the security of the United States; therefore, it becomes of great concern to the Air Defense Command which is charged with aerial protection of the United States. It has, for some time now, been the joint responsibility of the Air Defense Command and the Air Technical Intelligence Center to investigate Unidentified Flying Objects and to determine whether or not they represent developments outside our own scientific knowledge.

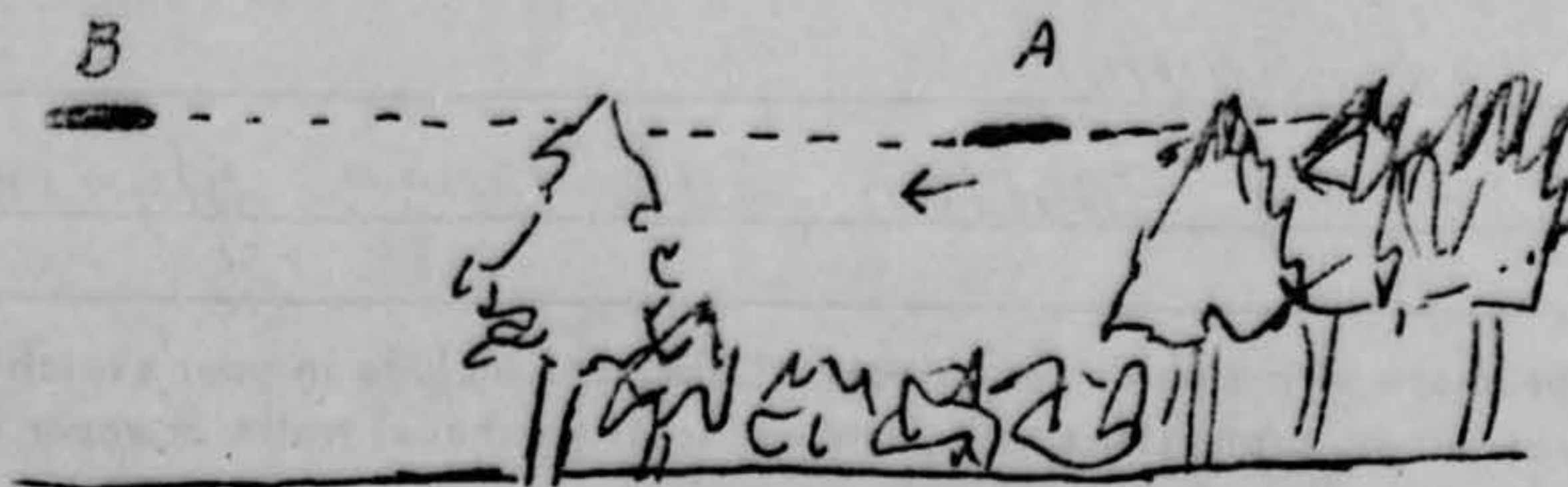

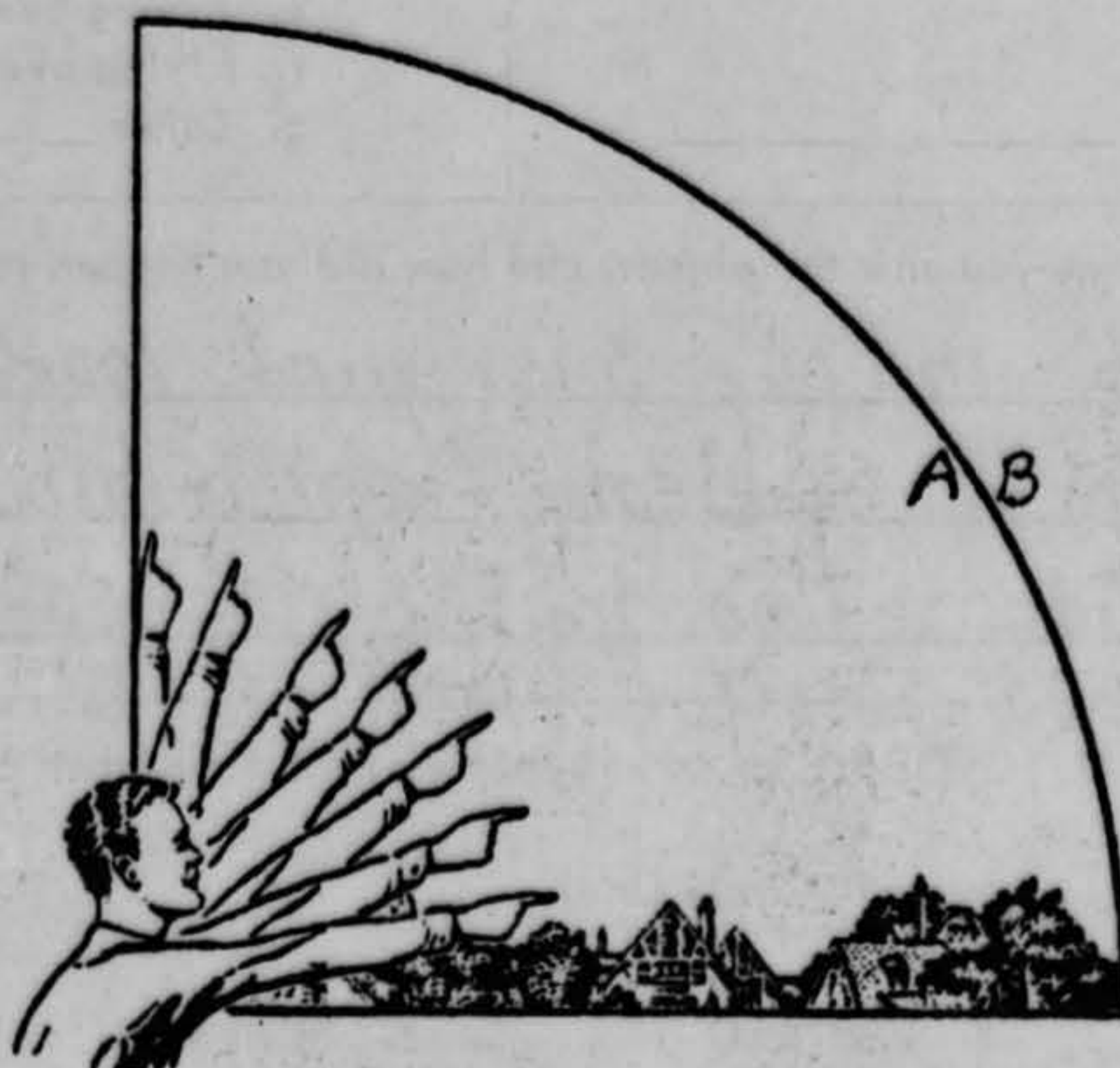
