



First - May I mention that shortly after passage of flying object my wife and I could not help but notice a very peculiar odor - nothing I could recall anytime in my life - can only say it was a plain stink - lasted for about 20 minutes -

[REDACTED] + myself were sitting on bench in back yard sipping cup of coffee - binoculars on seat - we sight planes and any object that happens to attract our vision. my wife first pointed out object described herein and remarked - what's that - on seeing it I remarked - that's a new one - we watched it approach it looked like what is called - flying saucer - it appeared dove grey in colour - no lights - I reached for glasses and had a little trouble getting it in field (10x50 glasses) on fixing it knew I was looking at something I had never seen before - but it was very plain. while holding glasses on object - I said to my wife - If there is such

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a thing as a flying saucer then we are seeing one - told it in view by stepping back ~~wind~~ - as by this time it circled directly overhead and headed north - (approaching from east) called to wife to keep it in view as it was passing over garage and I did not want to loose one second of sighting. I watched it go below garage roof line + dashed down to where Mrs. Stogood was standing - too late - she said just plain vanished.


I immediately questioned the Mrs. as to sound and her observation - nothing outstanding - no noise - no sound of any kind - no lights - no glow - no nothing - while we compared sightings we kept up constant look out for maybe a return - NONE - about five to six minutes later - I asked - what in blazes is that stink - she said - I was about to ask same thing - we checked alley + looked for smoke - none - just an awful stink - it remained about 20 minutes. We both agreed the colour was smoky grey or dove grey - object was Solid. I made rough sketch + notes right away. after making sketch did everything possible to figure out what it was - allowing for just about everything - nothing seemed to replace that which we had seen. The time was noted on observation + immediately afterward - this was due to other sightings of which we had been not to sold on - it was due to these other sightings that I purchased the binoculars and have since exchanged them for 16 X 50 from 10 X 50.
