Object was seen at about 2 to 3 miles elevation on 90dgr azimuth and disappeared at 2 to 3 miles elevation at 45dgr azimuth. At first, object seemed to rise slowly then move right at a 45dgr angle and then to the left at a 45dgr angle. Movement up & down was erratic. Obj seen visually for 40 to 45 seconds.		<b>11. COMMENTS</b> Object observed for 45seconds initial observation from inside building through window. Went outside to observe object. Possible bird (?). No data for conclusion.
