II. ACTING CHIEF, INTELLIGENCE DIVISION, WITH BOMBARDMENT WING. THE OBSERVING OFFICER WAS RELUCTANT TO MAKE HIS REPORT FROM FEAR OF RIDICULE. THIS EXPLAINS DELAY IN REPORT. THE OFFICER IS A MATURE, LEVEL HEADED INDIVIDUAL WITH SIXTEEN YEARS SERVICE IN THE AIR FORCE. HE IS CONVINCED THAT THE OBJECT OF HIS REPORT WAS NOT CAUSED BY ATMOSPHERIC CONDITIONS, AND THAT IT WAS NOT A METEOR. HIS DESCRIPTION OF THE SIGHTING FITS A JET EXHAUST EXCEPT FOR THE TERRIFIC SPEED. NO KNOWN AIRCRAFT COULD GO FROM THE HORIZON TO A POINT APPROXIMATELY

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THE (1) MILES PAST THE OBSERVER IN FIGURE (1) TO THE (1) SECONDS AS HE DESCRIBED HIS SIGHTING. THE PUBLISHING OFFICER HAS NO OPINION AS TO THE IDENTITY OR CAUSE OF THE SIGHTING.
