I. On 21 November 1956 at 2105 hours a stationary orange colored light was seen in the Great Bear Constellation. It looked similar to the planet MARS in color and size. The light stayed for 30 seconds after which it blinked two to three times and disappeared. The observer at MUEHLHEIM (4802N-0853E) did not believe that it was an aircraft.
