Object was first seen at 35 dgr elevation and disappeared at 60 dgr elevation after rising in elevation and moving away from 100 dgr azimuth. Object faded from sight after having been observed visually & through binoculars (8x40 power) for 1 1/2 hours. / 2. One red to green egg-shaped obj, size of grapefruit at arm's length. Obj 1st seen at 300 elev, 270° azi. Changed directions fast, no set pattern.		11. COMMENTS Mars at 265 dgr azimuth about 20-30 dgr elevation setting at 0830Z. Visually & thru binoculars.	

On November 24-35 near Pierre,
South Dakota a half-globe shaped object, giving off sparks, was
photographed by police radio dispatcher [REDACTED] over one of
the state highways.

- 1956, Nov. 26-(South Dakota?)-UFO seen in sky by a man & wife! AF reported a "Blip" on their radar at same time! "First Flying-Saucer Report in MONTHS," said Frank Blair on NBC's "Today" tv show. (What a whopper!) They never repeated the Report later...
- 1956, Nov. 26-South Dakota-Two more UFOs seen, reports ABC-News on Radio! (This may or may-not be the same sighting as above-Ed.)
- 1956, Nov. 25-Pierre, North Dakota-12:45am-Bright, red UFO photographed by 2 Policemen. Radar at Rapid-City reported to have picked-up object on screen & sent interceptors! Object hovered 50--to-100ft. above ground, a block away. Shaped like 1/2 an egg made no sound. Observed for about 1/2hr. before they left in car. It then seemed to follow their car!!
- 1956, Nov. 25-Hot Springs, S. Dakota-4:30pm-UFO seen from ground & on Jet's radar. Brilliantly lighted, Object flashed green, red & yellow lights (see Jan. 2 Report). It moved up & down in the sky. A Jet plane made passes at it, says Report! (Moseley)

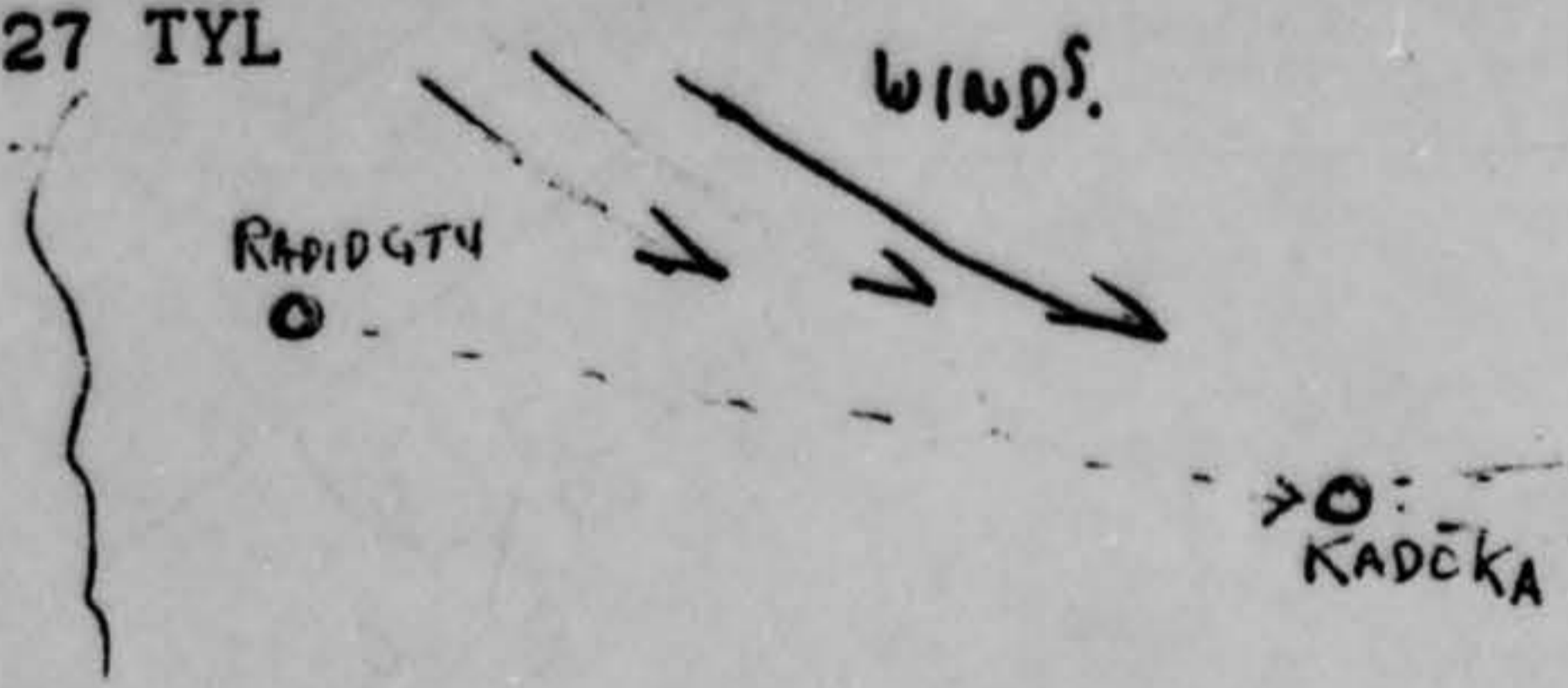
