Very red flashes, fm 1/10 to 1/20 the size of the object kept flashing and/or firing until the object went out of sight. Object was first seen at 30 dgr elevation, 135 dgr azimuth, and disappeared at 45 dgr elevation traveling west. Object was seen visually for 15 to 25 minutes. NO REPORT IN FILE.</b>		11. COMMENTS <b>Concur with reporting officer that sighting caused by a/c. Although there was a helicopter in the area &amp; the details of the sighting indicate that this was cause, the helicopter landed ten minutes before the obj disappeared. However, time in sight may have been incorrectly estimated. Therefore, prob aircraft is evaluation of this sight.</b>
