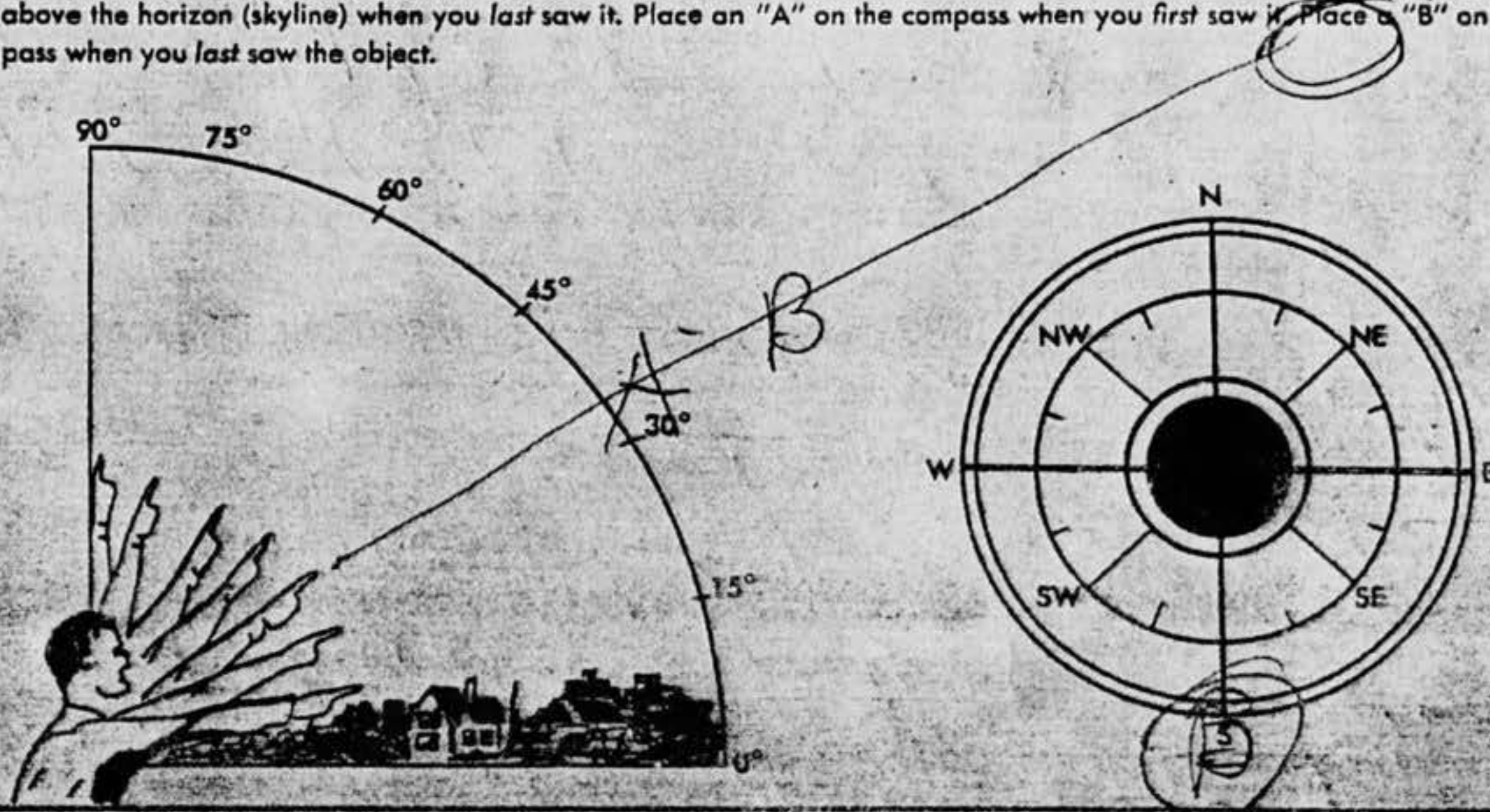

I was at the time of sighting in 1956 with a friend, [redacted] at a restaurant near Clover Field in Culver City having a hamburger when I notice 8 or 9 people, from the window where I was sitting, standing in the parking lot looking up and pointing into the air. I said to [redacted] "Let's go see what they are looking at." We did and upon joining the people in the parking lot observed what they are also seeing - a large silver disc at a 35% or 40% line of sight, still daylight and the moon to the left of object and several smaller objects that seemed to weaved weave themselves

around the large globular object for several minutes before disappearing seemingly inside larger object. The large object which was stationary for minutes, seemed to take off at thousands of miles an hour, because as we watched it speed away from the same angle of vision it diminished to the size of a pin dot in a matter of seconds until it was too far to see it

any more. The reason I am reporting

this observation at this time is because the other people in the parking lot undoubtedly reported this sighting and you probably have it in your files and I can verify this with [REDACTED] who was with me at the time.

We told my wife, mother and a few friends but that is about it.



Gentlemen:

The numerous sightings of unidentified flying objects that are currently being reported again brings to my mind a flying object which I observed about 10 years ago. I did not keep a record and do not know the exact date, but it is just as vivid to me now as it was the day it occurred and I have puzzled over it many times since.

As I recall, I reported it to the Strategic Air Command in Pasadena, but apparently it was assumed that I was some sort of a crackpot and little consideration was given. I was handed a standard form prepared for reports of this type, but it was not appropriate, that is, it failed to bring out the unusual features involved, and the representative that I talked to showed no interest in my story so I dropped the whole thing at this point.

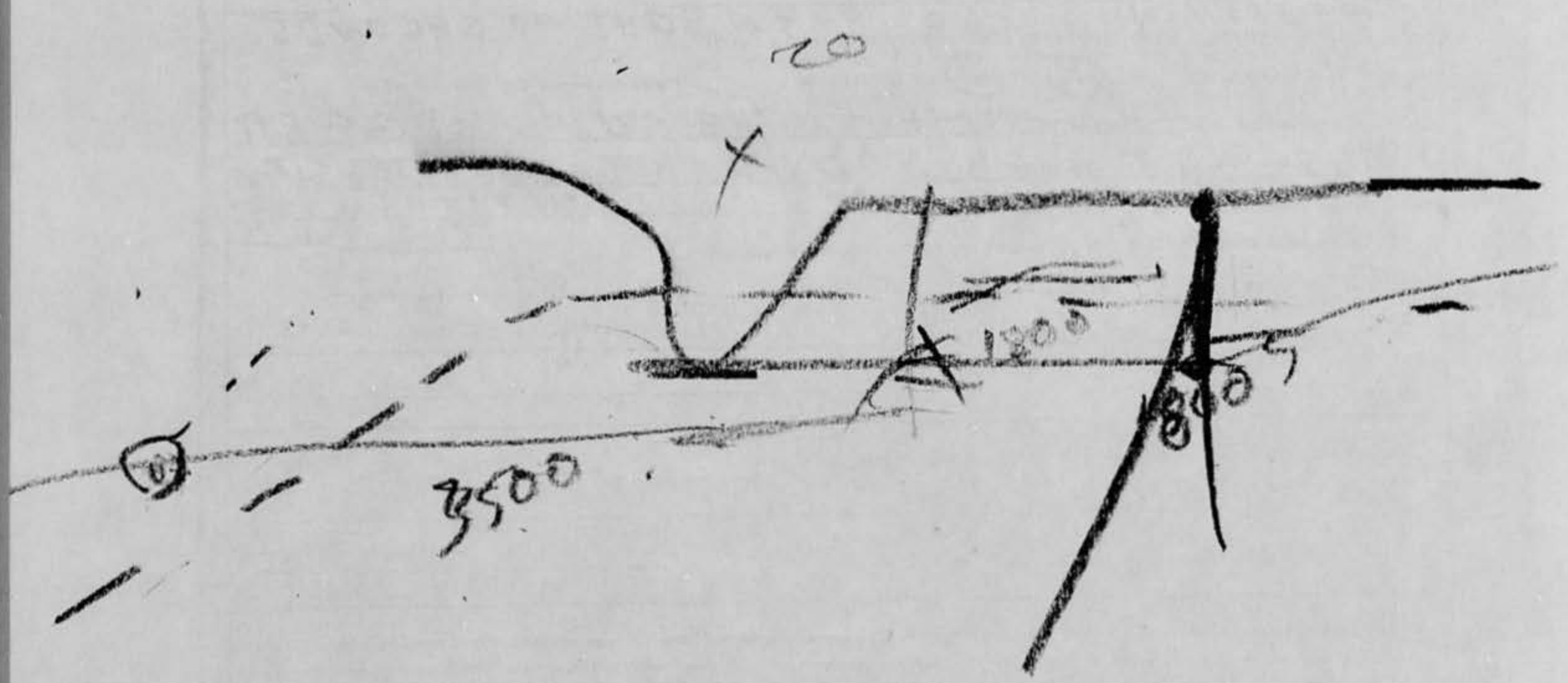
It no doubt had little value so far as national security is concerned but I am thoroughly convinced beyond a shadow of doubt that the object was real and under control of some sort, as it defied all laws of gravity. It was at close range in broad daylight, with no possibility of an optical illusion. No lights on it, no little green men or anything like that -- just its movements were unusual.

At any rate, I feel that the incident should be on record in case there are others who have reported seeing similar objects and following is a summary of the performance.

I was working at my desk on the 13th floor of the Federal Building, Los Angeles, when I casually looked out the window and saw at about the same level what I thought must be a balloon, but its shape seemed peculiar and its movement was not normal for a floating balloon and it immediately attracted my attention.

Further examination indicated that it was larger than an ordinary toy balloon, more oblong or pear-shaped. It was green in color with a slight metallic luster. As to size, I would estimate it to have been

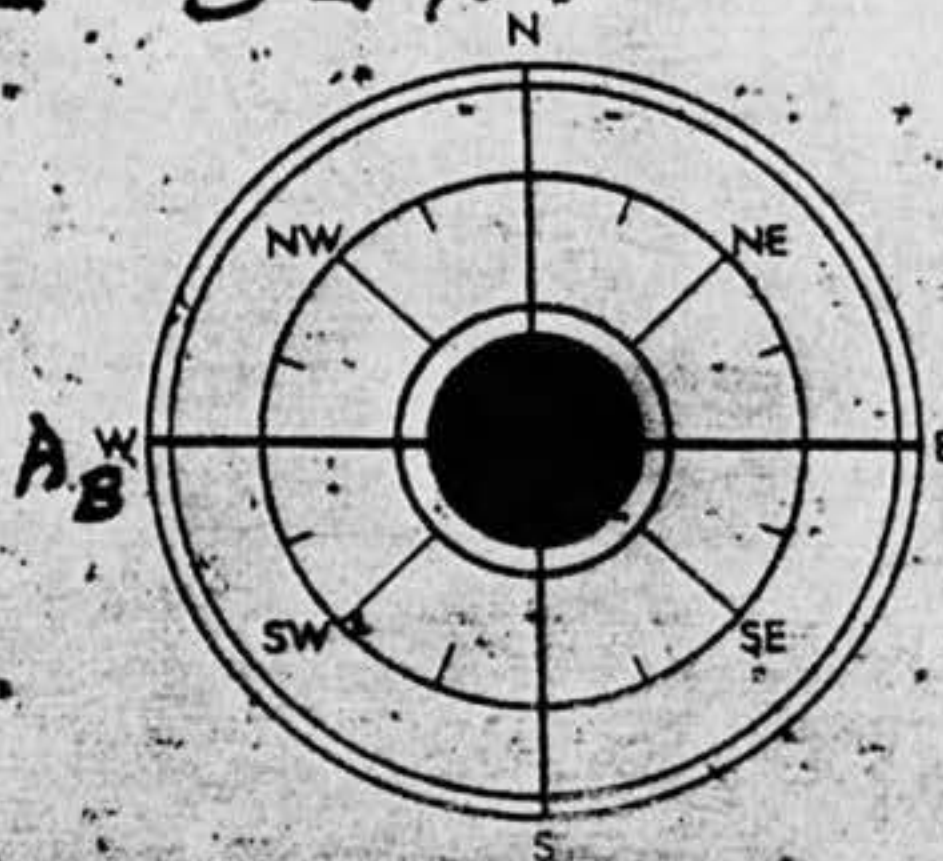
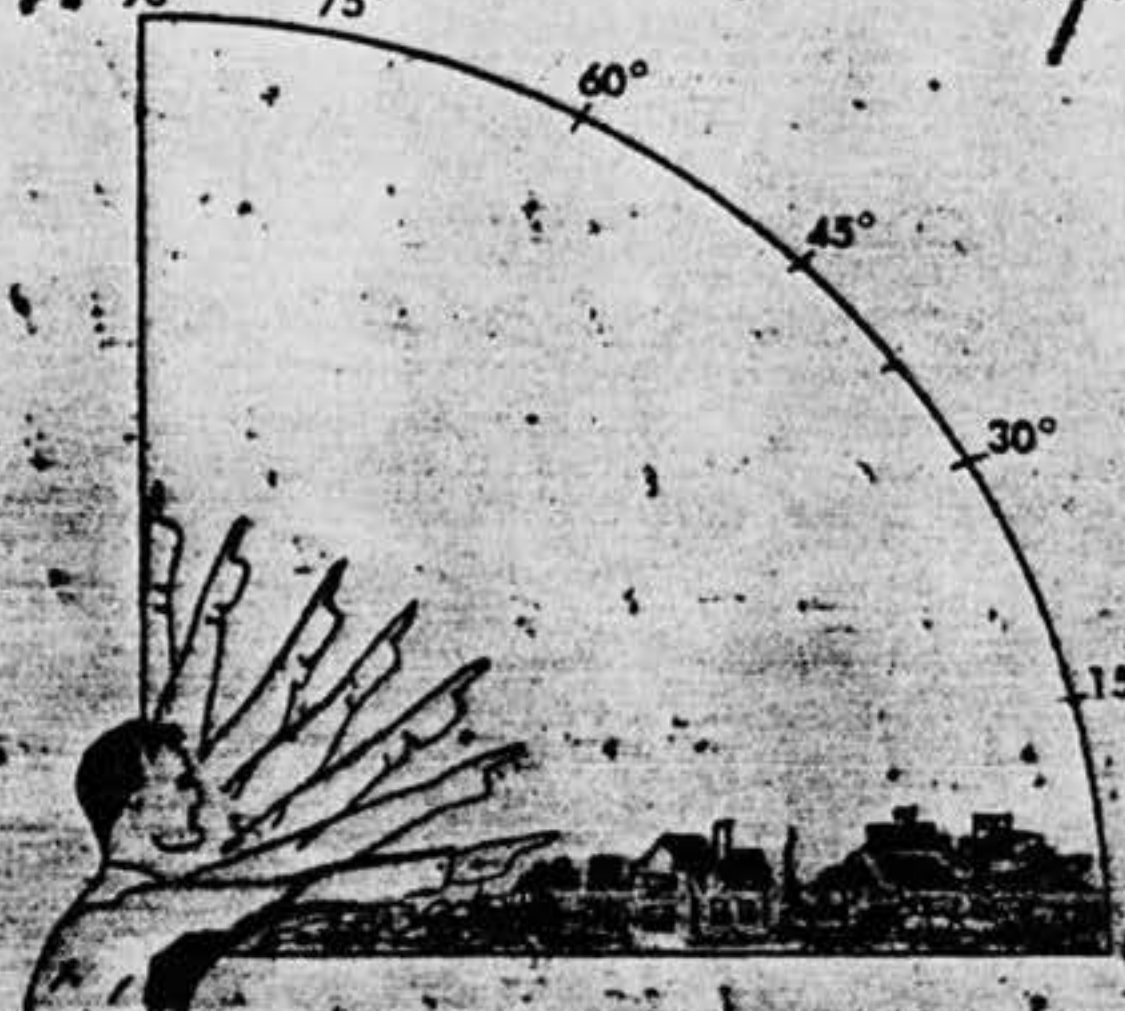

Dear Mr. ~~XXXXXXXXXX~~:

Please excuse our delay in answering your kind letter of 10 February 1967 in which you reported your unusual observation. I am unable to offer much of an explanation at this time without additional information. It could be possible you observed an upper atmospheric high altitude balloon. These balloons are programmed to fly at approximately 100,000 to 130,000 feet and have often been responsible for many UFO reports. This, of course, would depend on the length of the observation, wind data at altitude, etc.

Dear Major Quintanilla, Junior and Staff:

Today I read the special "LOOK" magazine edition about Flying Saucers or UFO's and saw your picture on page 60 and have decided to report you my rare observation just in case it helps humanity in the earth to its defense.

During the year 1956 I was living with my mother and brother (who by that time was already a pharmacist) at [REDACTED] Street [REDACTED] San Juan, Puerto Rico in a concrete house where its owner now lives and named [REDACTED] Telephone [REDACTED]. One day I was standing on the street in front of the house at 12:00 Noon and suddenly it gave me the idea of raising my arm vertically over my head and with the palm of my hand covering the sun (no clouds overhead) I saw right besides the disc of the sun a brilliant disc with steady light the size of the planet Venus as seen from the earth and for about 40 seconds at first it was circling 360 degrees and it stopped but it was at a height of what it seems to me over 100,000 feet. I called my mother and brother and they saw it when it was stopped. Also I called my neighbor a continental family and out of their house came Mrs. [REDACTED] wife of Major [REDACTED] of the Civil Air Patrol in San Juan, Puerto Rico, and I told her about the UFO and I am almost sure she saw it. I heard the [REDACTED] family later moved to Florida, U.S.A. and she had told me that she was from Saint Louis, Missouri and their children were [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]. I also called the José [REDACTED] family now living at [REDACTED] Street Urb. Parkville Guaynabo, Puerto Rico Telephone [REDACTED] and somebody saw it, too. A few days later I told it to Doctor [REDACTED] Former Dean of the college of Natural Sciences of the University of Puerto Rico, but he did not tell me any opinion about the UFO seen by me and gave me as a gift a book of Physics which I still have. As a matter of fact, I knew that the planet Venus is seen sometimes at 7:00 A.M; others at 6:00 P.M. but never at 12:00 Noon.

During World War II I was a Radio Operator with rank of sergeant in the Pacific Theater of Operations with serial number [redacted] in the 63rd. Troop Carrier Squadron 403rd. Troop Carrier Group 13th Air Force. My group commander was Colonel [redacted]. My Squadron commander was Major [redacted]. My communications section commander was Captain [redacted]. I served over 3 years from 1942 to 1945 and am now [redacted] years of age; I was born May [redacted] in [redacted] Street [redacted], Puerto Rico. Won about 14 medals and was in Micronesia, Melanesia, Indonesia, Polynesia, Australia, Hawaii, Phillipines, more than 40 States of U.S.A. Was inducted in New York City, N.Y. and Honorably Discharged at Fort Dix, New Jersey. My telephone number is [redacted]. Alcohol drinking was no good for my memory then and that's why I worked in a Radio Station on the ground but today I have quit drinking; only refreshments, like Coca Cola etc..

about two feet in mid-diameter and three feet in the elongated axis.

The object was less than a block away, passing over some lower buildings across Main Street to the east. It sort of floated along in a slow descent and it appeared it might come down on the freeway which passes a short distance north of the Federal Building. But it changed angle of descent and rose over the freeway heading for a parking lot on the other side. I was sure it would hit one of the cars, but it floated up over them and on toward a two-story building at the north end of the parking lot. Then without question I was certain it would hit this building, but when it came to within about ten feet of the building it took a sudden rise, moving parallel with the building wall up to the roof and then moved slowly over the top about five or six feet above the roof, somewhat like a dog often does looking for game. It then moved to the west side toward Main Street and floated almost straight down to about seven feet of the sidewalk. This was all seen so clearly that I could read the letters on the stop sign at the corner as it moved over near and about two feet above it.


Unfortunately there were no people in the area at the time to observe it. After moving slowly along above the sidewalk, it rose abruptly to the roof of the building, again meandering slowly around about ten feet above the roof. Then suddenly it took off at terrific speed and in an instant it passed out of sight over the Union Station about four blocks away.

One might wonder why I didn't call others in adjoining offices to witness the performance. Well, I was so absorbed in watching the strange movements that I didn't think of anything else, and further, I didn't realize what I was actually seeing until it took off at such unbelievable speed and disappeared from sight. No uncontrolled object could rise vertically, change direction so often and take off at such speed, particularly when it was not designed for speed.

I am now retired but at the time I was Supervisor in charge of the West Coast Region, Branch of Oil and Gas Operations, U. S. Geological Survey, Department of the Interior, and, if desired, my integrity can be checked through that Department.

If you know of any logical explanation for this unusual performance, I would certainly like to be advised, as I can not think of any. In any event, no one can ever convince me that I did not see the entire performance as reported.
