Dear Sir:

This is a belated UFO report. I was always curious whether anyone corroborated on this sighting. It would be interesting if your files confirmed this - if not, I just felt I should pass it on anyway for what its worth; even at this late date.

Date: 4 February 1957

Departed: San Francisco at 2400 hrs, 3 Feb 57 on TWA Constellation  
Destination: St. Louis via Kansas City

(I sat in the next to the last seat on the right side of the aircraft aft)

Approx. 0145 or 0200, (4 Feb 57) I was gazing out the window watching skyline, just faintly making out the silhouette of the mountain tops. It was pretty dark with no moon, <sup>none</sup> that I noticed anyway. There were scattered clouds as I noted some stars. As I was somewhat tired, but not sleepy, I kept my head leaning against the window sort of day dreaming. Suddenly, from underneath the right wing, this round, dull red object comes into view. I just watched it pass by below and past the Connie tail. It was heading straight west in level flight, just like it was heading for Frisco. Its speed would be compared to a passing Convair. I had a good 3 or 4 second look at it. All I can say is that it was round and dull red, just red enough to make out that it was round. I didn't see anything that looked like windows or openings. I do recollect from my notes at time, that there was a indication of something like static around the edge, not real obvious, however.

I've never lost any sleep over this, but I've always been wonder<sup>ing</sup> what it was. I started to write to TWA once after that flight, but never did. I think if the copilot had seen what I saw, I believe he would have made a 360 turn for another look. If your office has an opinion on this sighting, I would like to hear it. I can't give a guess as to size of object, but it had to be pretty large for such view at the altitude we were flying. It was a lot like looking up the tailpipe of a jet, but this was a lot bigger. I've thought also that it could have been something lit up on the ground, such as a red dome of some kind. Comparing the speed again, it would have to have been around 1000' ft. below to give the same speed relation. The only thing that bothered me on this was that I saw it below us and not above the horizon. If it was above the horizon I think I would have forgotten about it. Anyhow, I wanted to pass the info on as a matter of record. Acknowledgement of this letter is not solicited.
