COMMENTS OF PREPARING OFFICER:

- 1. Investigation conducted with the United States Weather Bureau and Weather Service, Andrews AFB, Washington, D.C., plus the characteristics of the object indicated by the Sources seem to eliminate the possibility that the object was a weather balloon. In addition, the wind conditions during the period of the sighting were such as to obviate the possibility of a balloon being present in the area of the sighting.
- 2. Information obtained from the United States Naval Astronomical Observatory, Washington, D.C., indicates that no unexplained astronomical phenomenon occured during the period of sighting. The duration of the sighting was such as to limit the possibility that the object observed by the Sources was a shooting star or meteor. The characteristics of the object as described did not conform favorably to a star or planet hypothesis.
- 3. On the basis of all the facts considered it does not seem probable that the sighted object was an optical phenomenon.
- 4. Taking into consideration the unreliability of the Sources, and the obvious difficulty of acurately judging height and speed at night it appears possible that the object was a jet aircraft. Conversations held with jet pilots indicated that a configuration as described by the Sources could be possible if a jet aircraft was flying with its afterburner in operation. Sources' residence is situated approximately 20 feet from a heavily traveled highway. The possibility exists that the sound of the aircraft was not heard because of highway traffic noise.
