1. SIX UNIDENTIFIED OBJECTS WERE SIGHTED WITH THE APPEARANCE OF AN UPSIDE DOWN LIGHT COLORED CONE. THE CONE WAS DARK ON THE INSIDE WITH STRINGS OR ROPES HANGING FROM THE OUTSIDE PERIMETER. THE CONES APPEARED TO BE ABOUT THE SIZE OF A QUARTER AND AT FAIRLY LOW ALTITUDE. ONE WAS LOWER AND APPEARED FIRST AND THEN THE OTHER FIVE APPEARED AS THEY CAME INTO VIEW. THERE WAS NO SOUND AND THE OBJECTS APPEARED ERRATIVELY IN THAT THEY APPEARED AND DISAPPEARED WHILE IN VIEW. THE OBJECTS WERE SAID TO BE TRAVELLING VERY FAST AND TO BE IN VIEW ONLY

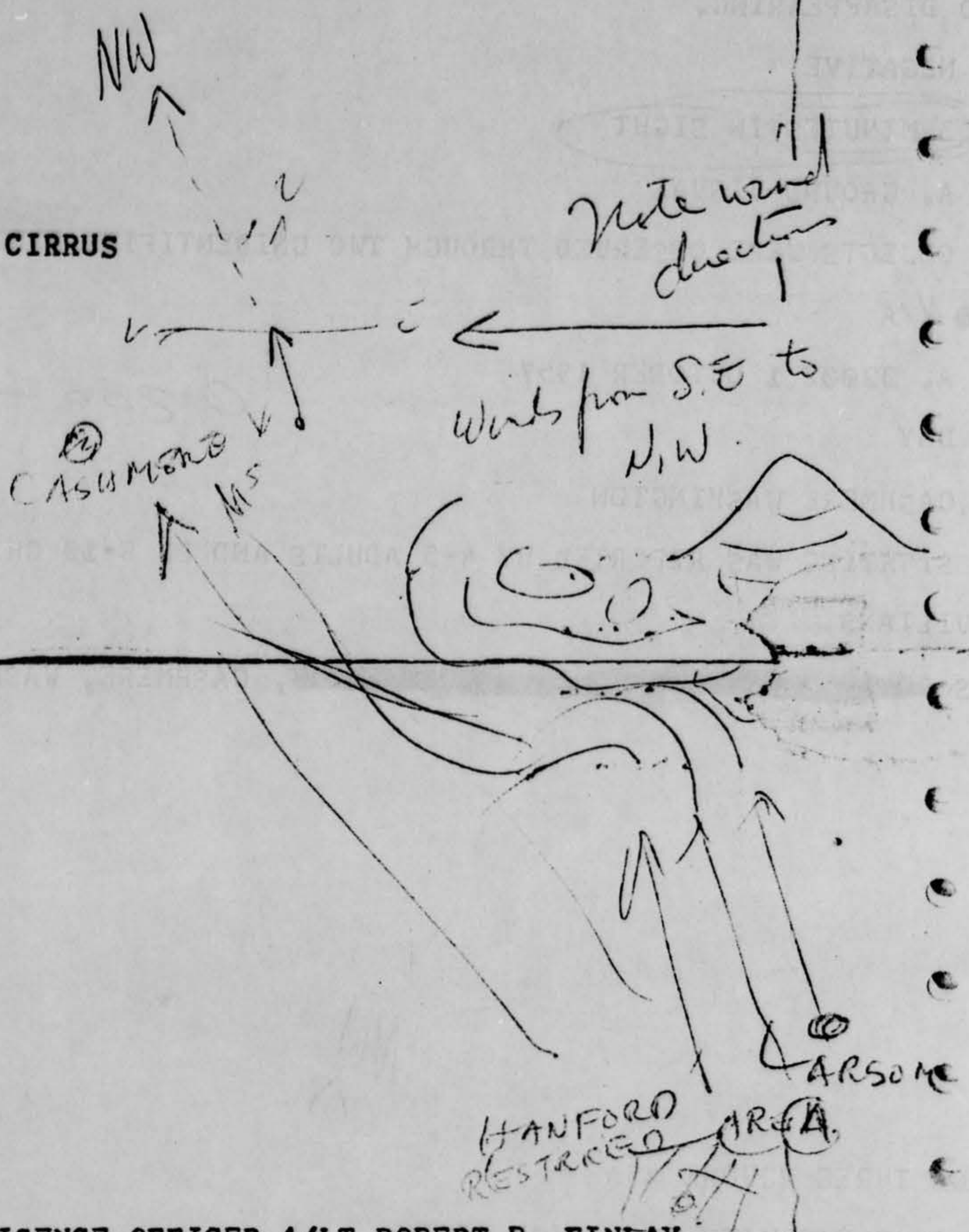

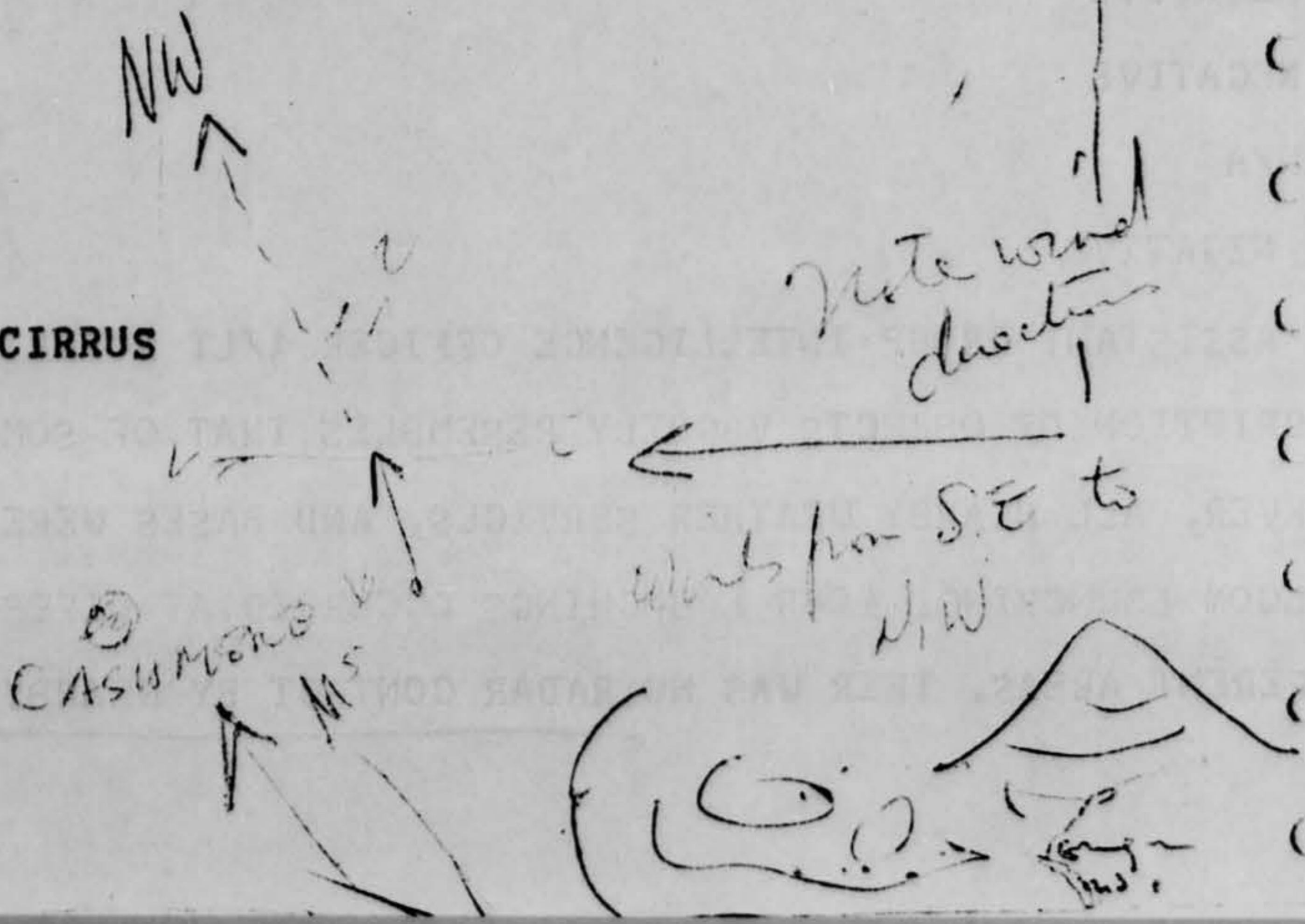
